Why would we have a special day devoted to a Church?

This very question might be the reason. If we think of a Church, perhaps we think of bricks and mortar, its history, what it symbolizes, or of the people it represents. What is a church? Our question must not rest there though.

St. Paul helps us to understand God's Church:

"You are God's building."

"God's temple is holy, and you are that temple."

God is here inside us, we are each a Church, holding God in our very soul. We know that when we gather in Jesus' name, he is here in our midst. Prayerful community is a Church.

But we also need a place to gather, to be Christ's Church, a place that represents holiness and hope. In the Lateran church in Rome we see a church that has been destroyed by fires, earthquakes, and attacks, yet each time it has been resurrected with new life.

In today's Gospel we read that Jesus zealously throws out that which does not make His temple sacred.

What would we like Christ to throw out from our temple? Material things? Maybe not sheep and doves, but perhaps too much focus on Amazon or alcohol, sports or money?

This week let us contemplate God's Church, His people, and ask God, what is getting in the way of our relationship with him. Lord, we are your Church, let us keep growing with You.





# From the Rector's (and Assistant Priest's) Hotel Room in Courtenay

(We're with Diocesan Leadership focussing on the ministry of mental/spiritual well-being in an age of anxiety)

### The Feast of the Dedication of the St. John Lateran Basiclica – November 9, 2025

Last Saturday Pope Leo XIV declared a Saint that I consider a 'friend' the 38<sup>th</sup> Doctor of the Church. He's the Anglican Oxford scholar who was received into what he called the 'one true fold' in 1845 in a little suburb of the University called Littlemore. Many consider that he anticipated the reforms of Vatican II with great insights into the development of Doctrine, the interdependence of faith and reason, and the signficance of the role of conscience in our faith. While studying in Oxford in



1996/97, searching for the identity of Christ's bride and body, I was fortunate to take a Newman Seminar with the late Fr. Ian Ker, a renowed Newman scholar and biographer. This not only led to a mystical sense of the living intercession of the holy doctor, but my own reception into

the Catholic fold in 1999. I am eternally grateful and ask that Doctor Saint John Henry Newman pray for us at St. Andrew's. Also notably, as you will hear at Sunday Masses, this Sunday is the annual feast acknowledging the dedication of the Mother Church of all Christian Churches in Rome in 324. It's also a significant day for me personally ①

This weekend, I'd like to offer a post Mass mini seminar for those interested in staying for 20 minutes for an opportunity to deepen our knowledge of the Scriptures, Holy Tradition and exchange ideas of how to apply Catholic principals to our lives. It's an experiment in deepening our sense of discipleship rooted in the Sunday homily, just as we're weekly ensuring that we make a good effort to evangelize our visitors and guests under the guidance of Matthew and a team committed to good hospitality. Just last Sunday, I spoke with man who had only come to two Masses in his life, and he was transfixed

by the beauty of the Cathedral and our liturgy while professing veritable ignorance of what he was experiencing. Exactly the kind of person we don't want to slip away without an occasion to meet, accompany, befriend and guide toward Christ.

Next Sunday, we'll be offering something similar and yet distinct from evangelism and discipleship. With Annette Turgeon and a few of the faithful, recognizing that so many of us are both in need of Jesus AND his loving community, we'll invite people to stay behind after Mass if they'd like an intercessory prayer. I'm often asked for prayers after Mass; blessings for occasions like birthdays and anniversaries, prayers for some healing or a difficult situation, and often for general spiritual well being. This 'monthly' offer will simply expand that potential to touch with the love of Christ more of our people. Finally, on a monthly basis I would like to experiment with offering a post Mass witness of ways to put this faith into action and will call upon our varied ministries to share inspiration and invitation to 'give' our faith away. May God's will be done.

As we approach the end of our liturgical year with the Feast of Christ the King on November 23<sup>rd</sup> and the commencement of Advent of November 30<sup>th</sup>, we'll venerate our Patron St. Andrew in a special way. On November 22<sup>nd</sup>, I will bless an exquisite holy icon written recently in Ukraine of the first apostle of Jesus and invite the parish to offer a Novena to St. Andrew each day until the 30<sup>th</sup>. Remember that he's one of the 20 holy relics displayed at the foot of the sanctuary for your faith's inspiration. Hopefully this will be a terrific Cathedral community preparation of the new season of mission and ministry.

Don't forget that we commence with Men's Scripture Study at 7:00 am this Wednesday in the Parish Library. Fr. Claude will offer Wednesday and Thursday 5:00 p.m. Mass also starting this Wednesday/Thursday. You may notice a large gathering at a Mass as we have two parishes planning pilgrimages to the Cathedral this week for the Jubilee Year of Hope. We welcome all to the Cathedral where the 'Worship is out of this world and the community love is down to earth'.

## We Remember, We Celebrate, We Believe

Explore the collection of relics, brought to St. Andrew's Cathedral by our third Bishop, Most Reverend Jean Baptiste Brondel O.M.I, which are on display in front of the Sanctuary:

#### Reliquary A (from top center then down left to right)

- 1. From the Manger of Our Lord Jesus
- 2. From the stone of the Anointing of Our Lord<sup>1</sup>
- 3. From the table of the Last Supper
- 4. From the swaddling clothes of the Infant Jesus
- 5. Bone from St. Anne, Mother (of Mary)
- 6. Bone from St. Andrew, Apostle
- 7. Bone from St. James the Lesser (the younger James)
- 8. Bone from St. Thomas Aquinas
- 9. From the woolen cloak of St. Joseph
- 10. Bone from St. Charles Borromeo
- The stone upon which Jesus' Body was prepared for burial.



#### Reliquary B (from top center then down left to right)

- From the Sudarium (burial facial veil) of our Lord Jesus Christ
- 2. From the Column of Flagellation of Our Lord
- 3. Bone from St. Joachim, Father (of Mary)
- 4. From the Column (of Flagellation) and the Crowning of Our Lord (see "Reliquary B. 2", above)<sup>1</sup>
- 5. From the Holy Sepulcher of Our Lord
- 6. Bone from St. James the Greater (the older James)
- 7. From the Crown of Thorns of Our Lord
- 8. St. Francis of Assisi
- 9. From the "Titulus" (the banner on the Cross)
- 10. From the Crypt of the Agony of Our Lord<sup>2</sup>
  - John 19: 1 2 St. John's Gospel states that following Jesus' flagellation, he was given the Crown of Thorns. <sup>2</sup>"Crypta" typically refers to a crypt or cave. This may be a reference to the Tomb, but more likely references the cave near the Garden of Gethsemane where Jesus and his disciples were spending the night when Judas came and betrayed him.




