Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

"Listen to Him."


Before we strive, achieve, or serve, we are invited to **stand in awe of Christ.**

So listen. Rise. And follow without fear.




The Church of the Transfiguration atop Mt Tabor in the Holy Land

From the Rector's Desk

2nd Sunday of Lent – March 1, 2026



From Ukraine to Puerto Vallarta to Tumbler Ridge, the news is full of sin, destruction and death. Our Lenten season is an annual reminder that the Good News of the Gospel of Life is both reality and hope in midst of the continuing effects of the Fall. In *Evangelium Vitae* (the Gospel of Life) by St. John Paul II, he coined the phrase that mission of the Church is

to propose and exemplify a “culture of life”, especially as the West suffers from a descent into a culture of death. Who and what might be promoting a culture of death is the subject of a fascinating book by two Catholic philosophers and entitled “Architects of the Culture of Death”. Many of the names, philosophies and ideologies they propose as agents of our current cultural malaise I recognize and some I don’t. Regardless, you may be interested in order to equip you as missionaries of the life of Jesus. This Wednesday night is a Diocesan event that addresses this exact mission. Hope to see you for the Speaker and Panel on “Dying to Meet You” Wednesday at 6:00 p.m.

As I highlighted some stewardship facts about funding the mission of the Cathedral last weekend, this weekend we’ll read and hear a little about our varied costs of ministry. The Parish Council, Finance Committee and I believe our sense of stewardship literacy requires a greater knowledge on the part of the parish to increase engagement by all, and close the gap between attendance and the giving of time, talent and treasure. Two of the 14 best practices named in a document on parish stewardship are 1) Being a Christ centred parish focussing on Disciple-Making; and 2) Having an active Stewardship Committee. While we are successfully striving to fulfill the first, we are working on the second. “Church members need to know why the Church exists and what it endeavors to do. We cannot be a country club where people show up to socialize and simply engage in worship by rote”. Thanks to all who are giving, and giving sacrificially. Thanks too for being flexible during the beautifying of the entire Cathedral interior. Plaster and paint work is proceeding well and is making a striking difference.

Bishop Joseph arrives for his Lenten Mission with us this weekend. Let’s pray that through the Holy Spirit his teaching might help us deepen in our Christian faith and service.

Dying to Meet You

Suffering / Death / Meaning / Hope

On Wednesday, March 4th from 6 pm – 8 pm Amanda Achtman will be coming to St. Andrew's Cathedral for a talk on her project *Dying to Meet You: Preventing Euthanasia, Encouraging Hope*. A moderator and four panelists, including Bishop Gary Gordon, will participate as well. As the Ethics Education & Cultural Engagement Lead for Canadian Physicians for Life and founder of Dying to Meet You, Amanda explores questions around death and dying through storytelling, beauty, and a deeply hopeful vision rooted in the dignity of the human person. This talk will equip you to better engage in these conversations and experiences in your own life because this concerns all of us. No charge. All are warmly welcome to attend.


Stewardship: Cost

“For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in.” (Mathew 25:36)

Did You Know: Cost

- In 2026, the annual cost of operating the Cathedral is \$925,000, or about \$2,500 per day.
- Salaries account for approximately 50% of annual operating costs, while utilities (gas, water) and building repairs (plumbing, electrical) amount to 5% and 3% respectively. Insurance is a large area of expenditure, totalling \$75,000 per year (8% of annual operating costs).
- Also, the Parish provides funds annually to support the needs of the Diocese. In 2026, this assessment is estimated to be \$169,000 (18% of operating costs).
- In addition to ongoing operating costs, the Parish has ‘capital’ costs to maintain the Church building, and property. An example of a capital cost is a major repair, or replacement, of the Church roof.
- For 2026, two capital projects are approved: interior Church painting (\$400,00) and front entrance security fencing (\$23,000). A ‘reserve’ fund (savings fund) is to be used for funding of these projects.
- The Parish has sizeable costs each year to operate, and to maintain, the Church



Sts. Perpetua and Felicity

Feast Day: March 7



Saints Perpetua and Felicity were two martyrs from the early Church who died in A.D. 203 in Carthage, today known as Tunis, Tunisia. Together with other companions, they were imprisoned for their Christian faith when the governor of Carthage enforced an edict by the Roman emperor forbidding conversion to Christianity or Judaism. Sts. Perpetua and Felicity are best known for their joy and calm amid terror and horrendous suffering.

We can observe details of their plight by reading St. Perpetua's diary, *"The Passion of Saints Perpetua and Felicity,"* in which she recounts her trial and imprisonment. After her death, St. Perpetua's journal was continued by a contemporary who documents how she and St. Felicity died in an amphitheater by the sword after facing a rabid heifer in the arena. Perpetua's last words were, **"Stand fast in the Faith and love one another."**

St. Perpetua's journal expresses her joy while suffering for Christ as follows:

"The day of their victory dawned, and they marched from the prison to the amphitheater joyfully as though they were going to heaven, with calm faces, trembling, if at all, with joy rather than fear. Perpetua went along with shining countenance and calm step, as the beloved of God, as a wife of Christ, putting down everyone's stare by her own intense gaze."

After their arrest and before they were imprisoned, St. Perpetua and St. Felicity were baptized together with other arrested catechumens. Both saints are also to be admired for their concern for their infant children. While in prison, St. Perpetua's mother and her brother, a catechumen, visited the two women. Her mother brought to St. Perpetua her little son, whom she was permitted to nurse and retain in prison with her. St. Felicity, who, at the time of her incarceration, was eight months pregnant, was concerned that she would not be permitted to suffer martyrdom like the others per a law forbidding the execution of pregnant women. However, two days before the amphitheater games, she rejoiced that she had given birth to a daughter, who then was adopted by a Christian woman.

St. Perpetua is also known for remaining steadfast in her faith despite the continual protests of a family member, her pagan father. At one time, she told him, *"We lie not in our own power but in the power of God."* And no matter how many times her father tried to get her to renounce her faith, St. Perpetua remained strong and stood fast even though her decision meant she was to be thrown to wild beasts in the amphitheater.

Famous for a series of visions involving the afterlife and her struggle, St. Perpetua also prayed for the soul of her young brother Dinocrates, who had died as a pagan. When at first she saw him in a vision even more alone, in a dark place, and hot and thirsty, she began praying for him despite being put in stocks herself each day. Finally she had another vision in which she saw her brother healed and clean and drinking from a golden bowl that never emptied.
