Baptism: If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Rector's Desk

1st Sunday of Lent – Rite of Election of the Unbaptized – February 22, 2026

"Charity is to be measured, not by what one has given away, but what one has left"

Archbishop Fulton Sheen

Lent has arrived and as promised (or threatened), during these 40 days and nights in the desert wilderness with Jesus, I'd like to focus a little bit on stewardship education and commence with a word of thanks. In fact, 'thanksgiving' is the meaning of the Greek word which gives us the 'Eucharist' and is the foundation of our lives in faith. The Cathedral recently received the gift of a baby grand piano from Roxanna Hartnell and her family in honour of their parents who were married, raised 9 children, and buried from this Mother Church of the Diocese. Sheila was a 40-year choir member, CWL member, altar flower arranger and soup kitchen volunteer. RIP Hartnell's and thanks for blessing the choir practice room with beautiful piano music.

I wonder if the entire congregation realizes that the Church is totally dependent upon charitable giving? Take a look at the bulletin "Did You Know?" Lenten education series on the subject of 'Funding', contributed from the Finance Committee. In my mind there is no question God has given us a significant responsibility to share the faith and live it generously at St. Andrew's; along with very fruitful opportunity to reach increasing numbers of people with the good news of Christ. Not only do we have huge obligations to maintain our buildings and grounds with projects like our \$400,000 interior plaster and paint project, but we have about 1,600 families to care for sacramentally, and increasing numbers of people seeking to become Catholic. We will need more of our parish family sensing a joyful obligation to contribute to the mission of the Church and contribute in a deliberate, consistent and generous way. I was taught decades ago that our giving to God is a blessing and should be proportionate to one's income. If not contributing, please start, and consider prayerfully moving from random offerings, to deliberate giving through envelopes or, better yet, pre-authorized debit. This is how my family contributes to St. Andrew's which ensures giving is never omitted regardless of holidays or absences. Many thanks for your commitment to the mission of Christ.

I'm so grateful for the opportunity to serve the West Coast parish of Tofino/Ucluelet and Ahousaht last week and offer four Masses: to their small catechism class, the Ahousaht First Nation community, a special Spanish Mass

for the Salvadorians and Mexicans working in the fish cannery and the English speakers able to come on a Friday. Not only did I have occasion to fortify the faithful with sacraments of anointing, confessions and the Eucharist, I was able to complement the local baptized faithful's effort to reach out to the wider community. Amazingly, a number of months ago a student mission trip from Victoria to Ucluelet coincided with a village event and their 'Night Fever' resulted in 400 of the 1800 village people actually coming into Holy Family Church. While we continue to work on our parish 'evangelizing' with hospitality the folk coming to our Masses who are new and curious about Catholicism, I look forward to looking outward to reach the unreached with Word and Good Deeds.

The wait for the Government Canada to reverse its decision NOT to allow our new Director of Musical Worship a work permit is both painful and aggravating. Please Lord!! But I'll be happy this weekend to announce the appointment of a new Coordinator of High School Youth Discipleship. Praise God! In the meantime, let us all enter a holy season of Lent with our 'prayer', 'fasting' and 'almsgiving' and take advantage of our gift to each family of a Bishop Barron Lenten devotional. Pray it daily as a family. Lenten graces to you all.

Dying to Meet You


Did You Know: Funding

- The Cathedral relies on parishioner donations to provide, and maintain, services. No government funding is received.
- Donations cover up to 90% of annual Church operating costs. Other revenue sources (hall rentals, interest income) pay for the remaining expenses.
- Parishioner donations are provided in 3 ways: envelopes, loose change and preauthorized payments. Offertory envelopes account for roughly 60% of annual donations, with loose change and automatic payments accounting for 30% and 10% respectively.
- In 2024, regular donations amounted to \$665,000.
- Charitable tax receipts are issued for known donations (envelopes, preauthorized payments) and in 2024, about 1,000 households received tax receipts. Approximately 36% of these households contributed under \$100 per year (average of \$2 per week), and a further 33% contributed between \$100 to \$499 (less than \$10 per week).
- At present, and based on this information, a large amount of annual donations is provided by a relatively small proportion of the congregation.
- BC donors receive a combined federal and provincial income tax credit of about 20% on the first \$200 donated each year, and about 46% on amounts over \$200.

The Diocesan Permanent Pastoral Synod is a chance for all people in the Diocese of Victoria to have their voice heard. Our thoughts will help Bishop Gary and other leadership discern and direct the future of our diocese. This cycle, we will be exploring questions about how to bring the Good News to our communities. 
Hope Alive Retreat


