As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

**Marriage:** Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

## From the Rector's Desk

### 6th Sunday of Easter

Since the beginning of the New Year, I've been hoping for an occasion for a joyous parish social celebration that would hinge upon the arrival of our new Music Director Iason. Finally, we can pencil something in for the evening of June 20<sup>th</sup>. After some discussion with staff and volunteer leaders, more details will be forthcoming, but I'd like you to set aside that evening. I imagine we'll have something of a recital by Iason and possibly choir members on both organ and piano. Potentially we might call upon some musical talent from the parish and enjoy a concert in the freshly painted Cathedral from about 6:30–7:30. This would be followed by a wine and cheese, finger food and refreshment social in the Parish Center that may have to spill onto the lovely side garden adjacent to the building. # Raising Awareness is Prevention: Abortion and Euthanasia – March for Life: May 14, 2026

*From the Desk of Respect Life Ministry.*

## — Euthanasia (MAID) History and Expansion —

The normalization of euthanasia as part of the individual's End of Life Care option demonstrates how legislation can fundamentally affect public perception.

**Legalization (Bill C-14):** Assisted suicide and euthanasia were legalized in June 2016 for adults with "grievous and irremediable" illnesses whose death was "reasonably foreseeable."

**Expansion (Bill C-7):** In March 2021, the law was relaxed to remove the requirement that natural death be reasonably foreseeable, allowing individuals with serious, incurable illnesses and intolerable suffering to qualify, even if not terminal.

**Mental Illness Clause Delay:** While eligibility for persons whose sole condition is mental illness was planned to expand in 2024, it has been delayed until March 17, 2027, to allow more time for health system preparation.

**High Public Support:** Public support for MAID has been consistently high and appears to be growing. A June 2023 Ipsos poll (Public Opinion Polling Sector Institute) indicated that support for the 2015 *Carter v. Canada* decision, which legalized MAID, remains strong: **84% of Canadians support the 2015 *Carter v. Canada* decision. Support is 89% among people over the age of 55. Support is 83% among Catholics. Support is 79% among Protestants.**

**Rapid Integration and Growth:** MAID, which is overwhelmingly delivered as euthanasia (a lethal injection by a health care provider), is now considered a normalized part of clinical care. It has been described as a "death therapy" that is aggressively promoted as medical practice. The practice now accounts for 4.7% of all deaths in the country, a rate second only to the Netherlands, and is considered Canada's fourth leading cause of death.

**Legislative Expansion:** Public acceptance has driven rapid legislative expansion. Since its legalization in 2016, the law was significantly broadened in 2021 (Bill C-7) to remove the requirement that a person's natural death be "reasonably foreseeable". **This vast expansion has been criticized for changing the focus of medicine from treating suffering to eliminating the suffering patient.**

**Shifting Perceptions of Suffering:** Death is increasingly viewed as an escape from suffering and is, according to some critiques, actively promoted as a solution. The most

commonly cited reasons for a MAID request are not inadequate pain control (cited by just under 60% of cases), but rather the loss of ability to engage in meaningful activities (over 95%), loss of dignity, and feeling like a burden on others.

**Proactive Offerings:** Health Canada encourages proactive MAID discussions and referrals, and some provinces and medical groups require doctors to inform or offer the option to eligible patients. This shifts the initiative from a patient-led request to a clinician-suggested intervention, further cementing its place as a standard option.



## Thursday, May 14<sup>th</sup>

Participants will then gather at Centennial Square and at 1:45 pm they will proceed down Government Street to the BC Legislature, where the rally will commence at 2:15 pm.

A gala dinner will be held at St. Patrick's Parish with guest speaker Elizabeth Sutcliffe. Doors open at 5:00 pm. The deadline to reserve a ticket is Monday at noon.
