**Baptism:** If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

**Marriage:** Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

**Funeral:** Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

## From the Rector's Desk

Trinity Sunday

May 31, 2026

Two weeks ago, an extraordinary thing happened. The Ahousesht First Nation held a potlach meal at St. Joseph's to honour and thank representatives of the Catholic Church in Victoria for our support, solidarity and friendship. Elders, chiefs and elected council members expressed their hope for 'intergenerational love' and continued journeying together with respect in faith. Some school and Diocesan/parish leadership were blanketed and received gifts for which Bishop Gary and I expressed humble thanks. It was so positive and unfortunately won't be reported in local or social media. Praise God anyway!

A joyous occasion was had last Sunday as two dozen children received the sacraments of Confirmation and first Holy Communion celebrated by Bishop Gary Gordon. The parish is grateful for Kat and Jade who taught the younger children for the year, Sonya who catechized the teens and Matthew who provided so much administrative support for the parents and children throughout the year. We're also blessed to have had May and her family along with the Knights of Columbus provide a wonderful reception. I'm grateful for your increased parish financial support which ensures we have the resources to support these crucial ministries for the sacramental and pastoral well being of the Cathedral flock. These are wonderful occasions of grace with tremendous spiritual fruit as expressed by retreatants. ## Being a Missionary in Your Own Parish

In Pope Leo's new encyclical, *Magnifica Humanitas*, he reminds us of the great (in fact, magnificent) dignity of every human person because they have been willed, created, and loved by God — a dignity which no amount of sin, failure, humiliation, or exclusion can diminish. We are created in the image of God, who is *relational*: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in an eternal giving of love. What does that mean for us? It means we too are "called to communion with God and can fully discover our true selves *only in sincere self-giving*," as Pope Leo explains.

(1) Because of our baptism, each of us is given the added dignity of *being entrusted by Jesus Christ to actively carry on his mission* in our specific place and time.

(2) Each specific person you may encounter has the dignity that says *they're worth the mission*.

We don't have to go to a distant country to be a missionary — you can be a missionary right here in your own parish. All are called to the mission, but as St. Paul teaches, *there are many gifts, but one Spirit*. In other words, there are lots of different ways to use the unique gifts God has given you to help others to find Christ's love in the Church. A couple of specific needs we have right now are:

**Catechists:** If you're gifted in teaching little ones, helping them to learn about God's love and prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation, and First Holy Communion is a wonderful way to help bring them closer to Christ. Think about joining our team of catechists and helping to co-lead a class!

**RCIA Sponsors:** Many adults seeking to become Catholic will be starting the RCIA program this fall. They'll each need a sponsor who will accompany them through this journey at the weekly Thursday evening sessions as a fellow imperfect person who loves Christ, help guide them in the Catholic life, and above all pray for them.

If you are free on Friday nights at around 7pm, I invite you to join us for rosary before we begin our ministry. We meet at the benches beside the parking lot outside of Pier A.

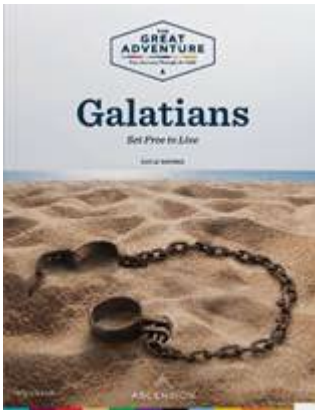

Pope Leo XIV's Encyclical Letter, *Magnifica Humanitas*, was released this week. It focuses on safeguarding the human person in the time of artificial intelligence. The letter is dated 15 May, to commemorate the 135th anniversary of Pope Leo XIII's Encyclical Letter, *Rerum Novarum*.

The Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development has released 5 infographics outlining the key elements in each chapter, which we will be sharing over the next 5 weeks.
