From the Rector's Desk Exaltation of the Holy Cross September 14, 2025

The 24th Sunday of Ordinary Time is replaced by the fixed date feast of the Holy Cross which lands on a Sunday this year. The celebration commemorates the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem in 335 AD and reminds us, as every Mass does, of Christ's triumph over death. Alleluia! It seems apropos with so many funerals and memorials we're offering at the Cathedral of late. I'm certainly grateful for the ministry of our staff and volunteers to assist in these corporal and spiritual acts of mercy for the souls of the departed; as well as offering the ministry of consolation for grieving family members.

Jackie and Harry Ray have parted for an extended post retirement overseas holiday and I'd like to welcome back the choirs and musicians this weekend to a slightly altered schedule of music ministry. Likely you won't notice much difference on Sunday, as the musicians and choirs will resume at 9:00 am and 11:00 am with the exception of omitting their mid-week rehearsals in the absence of a director. Kathleen Edge has happily agreed to volunteer as a coordinator as we pursue our candidate for the position, and hope to have the position filled by January 1st 2026. Meanwhile the Sunday 5 pm Mass with Fr. Sean and the El Shaddai choir won't skip a beat. And I'd like to welcome two couples to assist us musically at the 5:00 pm Saturday Mass: Steve and Michele formerly of St. Joseph's transferred here last year, and Fabian and Adrianna who hail from Columbia and offered my former parish their musical gifts at Our Lady of the Rosary. They'll be alternating weeks, with Steve and Michele starting this Saturday. Speaking of the Sunday afternoon Mass, I'll be attempting this year to join Fr. Sean monthly, in order to preach the homily and be a presence to the robust community as their Rector.

As with the rest of our culture, September is the commencement of a new season of education, and along with the rest of the Diocese this weekend, we'll plan a recommitment and commissioning of catechists and formators in the essential work of evangelization and disciple making. We are so blessed to have families and children in the parish and we entrust them to the Lord Jesus through the good work of our catechists. We're also seeing a flood of interest from adults seeking reception into the Catholic fold. It's wonderful and a time-consuming process. I contact each person expressing an interest to arrange a face-to-face visit and listen to the story of their faith journey. It is a privilege to hear how God has, and is working in the lives of so many who believe they've discovered something of the good news of Jesus in the

Catholic Church. Please pray for them and our selection of sponsors to mentor and accompany each one.

As mentioned at Mass announcements, there are numerous good works of ministry this month. Please consider registering for the "Not in My City" presentation on Saturday the 27th. This is our RLM/Cathedral initiative to curb the pernicious practice of child exploitation. All details are in the bulletin, the pews and Annette is available for questions. The same weekend is another St. Vincent de Paul/Knights of Columbus food drive to "Cram the Van" with non perishables for the poor. Our Seniors are encouraged to build community with a session on "Beating Winter Bugs and Blahs" on Thursday September 25th after the noon Mass. With Rita's return to the office, we'll be processing a number of applicants for the Office Assistant position and calling some for interviews. We're grateful for all who took time to make an application.

Break free from the addictive cycles of lust, pornography and sexual addiction.

This fall, St Andrews Cathedral is again offering a men's ministry called **Break Free** that is designed to help men find freedom from sins of lust and discover the beauty of God's plan for sexual intimacy.

From one of our participants last spring: "If nothing else, joining Break Free gave me the life changing realization that I'm not alone in my struggles, nor am I crazy or solely irredeemable. I would urge any man who struggles with lust, habitual; masturbation or sex addiction to prioritize joining this group as it might be the most important thing you ever do".

Chains are broken and lives can be restored. Discover how to renew your mind and break destructive patterns.

Break Free will meet at St. Andrew's Cathedral (Mother Theresa Lounge) in a small-group format to provide a safe, anonymous space for men to be accountable to each other. This is a place where single or married men over the age of 19 can come together for support and acceptance.

We will go through a 12 week curriculum that will cover:

- Forged: 33 Days Toward Freedom (Jason Everet, https://chastity.com/products/forged/)

REPORT SEXUAL ABUSE TO AN INDEPENDENT AGENCY
