Baptism: If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Faith Like Abraham's

If anyone ever asks you what faith is, share with them Chapter 11 of Hebrews in the Bible. The very first line in the chapter says it all: "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen," and then recounts all the people who lived by their faith, like Abel, and Enoch, and Noah, and of course Abraham.

"All these people were still living by faith when they died," the passage says. "They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth" (Hebrews 11:13).

When we are too comfortable in this world and in this life, we forget that "...though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." (Luke 12:15). Indeed, we forget that this life is but part of our journey.

The ancient people of faith were always conscious of this. They "were longing for a better country—a heavenly one" (Hebrews 11:16). How else can we explain the readiness of a father, Abraham, to offer his son, whom he loved, to the Lord?

Abraham loved the Lord and he knew the Lord. He knew the Lord as a Lord of mercy and as someone who kept his promises, including the promise that there would come forth from him, "...himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore." This was the Lord who gave Abraham, at age 100, and Sarah, at age 99, a son, Isaac.

When your faith is shaken, journey back to the Bible to all the men and women of faith whose lives are a testament to God's power, His might, His mercy and His love! Not only that, go back to your own life and remember all the times God has shown you His great love, and be renewed.

From the Rector's Desk 18th & 19th Sundays in Ordinary Time August 3 & 10, 2025

Over the course of the past year, with increased ministry programming to meet the needs of a significant rise in attendance at Masses, Parish Council and I have determined that now is the time to add to our staff. I'm pleased to announce the addition of a lay Pastoral Assistant at St. Andrew's (a position I have held part time in the past). Many of you have been pleasantly served by Matthew Orlowski in the front office, and starting September 2, he will continue to serve in a new role as my assistant. His role will be varied but will focus on the ministry of reception and hospitality of our visitors, guests and newcomers, as well as fostering the leadership of the expanding small group ministries to advance the growth of our parish in Christ's discipleship. Matthew and I have discussed this transition for a considerable time and believe a year-long contract is a good path forward as he also enjoys his first year of marriage to Of course, this means we'll need a replacement for him in the front office and Rita has an invitation for that position in the bulletin elsewhere. It goes without saying that the necessary expansion in staff will require a corresponding increase in giving by For those already sacrificially offering a contribution to the Lord's work, thank you. For those who aren't, please consider participating in the financial support of this great Catholic mission. In other personnel news, the Director of Musical Worship hiring committee and I are back to the drawing board as our Canadian application process has failed to secure a new Director. We had hoped for a person in place by September but that isn't likely to happen now. As disappointing as it is, we'll have to pivot into a plan to have the coordination of our musical worship through capable volunteer members of the music ministry at the Cathedral. Our net is being cast beyond Canada and we continue to ask for your prayers for the right person to help us offer beautiful liturgies of worship, while expanding the sense of loving community and service in Christ.

The Refugee Committee welcomed our latest 'newcomer' family this past week and I hope to introduce you to them soon. They have endured more suffering and hardship than I can imagine and are extremely grateful for our prayerful support through our committee's diligent efforts. Praise God! Also last weekend it was a joy to offer a special blessing for grandparents and welcome to the front of the sanctuary grandparents and their grandchildren. What joy! Less joyful however was the presence at the 11:00 Mass of a person suffering multiple deficits and who has caused significant alarm at the

parish, the Soup Kitchen and elsewhere in town. commended the good work of our volunteers and security personnel in managing what could have been a more volatile situation. Thanks be to God. I continue to offer voluminous ministry to those entering into happy holy matrimony. For many, they have waited 'outside' communion with the Church and required assistance to sacramentally come into 'full communion' with Christ and his Church and thereby return to the practice of the sacramental faith. While this is considerable time and effort for the couples and us as staff, it's a wonderful work of service and charity. Our priest shortage was brought to my attention as Fr. Dino unexpectedly had to return to the Philippines for the funeral of his mother (may she rest in God's peace), and thereby cancel covering for a weekend of holiday for me. The only two other retired clergy who might help are already committed to covering Masses for other holidaying priests. I'll need to remain that weekend myself and hope to defer a holiday weekend. But it's conceivable that in the near future we'll have little option but to offer a Liturgy of the Word with communion in the absence of a priest and the celebration of the Mass. Pray to the Lord of the harvest for vocations.

We successfully connected with Utility and Housekeeping crew members and strengthened bonds with the Spa and Casino groups. We had a particularly significant conversation with the Utility group who shared their struggles, noting they feel their roles are the hardest onboard yet the least compensated. For the August 23rd Mass, we're estimating around 30 attendees.

We have scheduled a Mass for the Saturday ships for August 23rd at 9pm, at the Edelweiss Club. Our wives have graciously volunteered to cook for the seafarers. While food will be sufficient, the seafarers normally take out additional food because they miss home cooked meals. 

Sacramental Preparation 2025–2026 Registration Now Open!



Registration is now open for the 2025–2026 year of Sacramental Preparation! Children at least 7 years old and teens will receive weekly catechesis to help nurture them in

the faith and grow as a community while preparing to receive the grace of the sacraments of Reconciliation (Confession), Eucharist (1st Communion), and Confirmation.

Our sacramental preparation program is designed as a two-year program running from fall into the spring. Children in Year 1 will prepare for the sacrament of Reconciliation, then in Year 2 they will prepare for the reception of their First Communion as well as Confirmation. Teens will prepare for any sacraments they may have missed in a separate one-year program.

Greetings all! I have been overwhelmed and so grateful for my retirement events and for all the cards, gifts and tributes that have come my way. I particularly want to thank the parish and music ministry planning committee and the parish council for the lovely gathering on June 29th. The decorations, food, spoken and musical tributes and hospitality were incredible. The gifts I received were amazing. I have been truly spoiled. A special thanks to Faye Baligod and her hospitality team and Rita, Kathleen and Kelly.

I can hardly believe that I have served the Church as Director of Music for 29 years and am now retiring from that role. I have so many wonderful memories and people to thank for making that time truly a privilege and an ongoing faith experience!!

My journey to the Catholic Church began far before these past 29 years. I moved to Victoria in 1971 to work as a physiotherapist, and was not a church musician or even a Catholic at that point in my life. I met my first Catholic guy, Harry, and we were married St Andrew's Cathedral the following year. I became a Catholic in 1982 at St Andrew's and then began my second career in church music.

I like to say I started from the ground up as a "Baby Catholic". I sang in the choirs and became more involved in many aspects of the parish over the years including Children's Liturgy, Parish Council and social events. I participated in music and liturgy workshops in the diocese and served in music leadership roles at St Joseph the Worker and St Andrew's in the late 80's and early 1990's. An opportunity arose to step into the Director of Music role at St Andrew's in 1996. I started with only the blessings of the former music director, Chris Morash and Fr Michael O'Connell's faith in me. The Holy Spirit at work and the Grace of God have brought me through 29 years of ministry!

These years have been a real faith journey for me, an opportunity to meet, share and learn what the Catholic faith is to so many people in our parish and across the diocese, and to grow in my own Catholic spirituality. I am very grateful to all who I have met along the way.

First I want to thank all the bishops who I have worked with over the years. My first bishop was Remi de Roo. Our friendship continued over the years and many special events took place in his faithful teaching of Vatican II principles. I have worked under Bishop Ray Roussin, Bishop Richard Gagnon and Bishop Gary Gordon. I have also worked with many wonderful priests over the years. It has been an honour and a privilege to serve our church community with all of them.



As well as providing music for St Andrew's parish, diocesan liturgical events have been a part of my responsibility at the cathedral over the years. Ordinations, installations and funerals of bishops, priests and deacons, special events, anniversaries and yearly Chrism Masses have been exciting times and an ongoing challenge to plan appropriate music.

As music director at St Andrew's, many other opportunities have come my way such as liturgical celebrations with St Andrew's Elementary School for many years, ecumenical prayer services for Christian Unity week, Prayer in the Style of Taizé, parish and Island Catholic Schools liturgy workshops. Serving on local and national liturgical committees has been inspiring and educational. Providing music with the Sisters of St Ann and Poor Clare Sisters has been inspiring. I have been part of so many aspects of the diocesan liturgical life and it has all been amazing!!

Most importantly, I have been blessed with a hard-working and faith-filled music ministry during my tenure at St Andrew's. Wonderful singers and musicians practice and provide music week after week, year after year for our parish community as volunteers, and are incredible examples of dedication. Their time commitment to this ministry is extraordinary. What you hear at a one-hour liturgy is the culmination of several hours of preparation and practice. Many have served and continue to serve in music ministry for over 20 years and some I have shared music with for many

more years than that—you know who you are!! The 2020 Covid Pandemic changed all of our lives and our priorities. It was a transition time when many choir folk retired or moved on to other things. Music ministry has slowly started to build again in the last few years. Our choir family continues to be a wonderful group of people dedicated to serving their church community. I am so grateful for the opportunity to have shared music with them. El Shaddai Music Ministry, you have been so great to work with and you provide a great contribution to our parish and diocese. Filipino community, I appreciate the parents and children who have joined me for special celebrations such as 2024 Christmas Pageant and Stations of the Cross on Good Friday the past three years.

I cannot thank enough the cathedral staff, clergy, and parish councils who supported me over the years, especially the present folks. Rita has saved me from many hours of frustration on the computer, worked with me to produce programmes for many events including the seasonal music bulletins, xeroxing, helped with choir organization, liturgical events and ministering to families dealing with funerals and marriages. Matthew has fielded phone calls for me and given me many a detail for weddings and funerals. Steve has always been around to do any maintenance job I ask him to do. I could not have done this without all of you. A special thanks to Theresa Vogel, who has shared many a service with me throughout Covid and onward to today. Theresa has been part of the cathedral music ministry for almost 50 years.

Finally I thank the parish for your ongoing support. I am eternally grateful for these past twenty-nine years given to me to serve St Andrew's parish.

I have a little quote by John Wesley given to me by my good friend Barb to inspire us to keep singing our praises to God:

Sing all. See that you join with the congregation as frequently as you can. Let not a slight degree of weakness or weariness hinder you. If it is a cross to you, take it up and you will find a blessing.

Sing lustily, and with a good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead, or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength.

Sing modestly. Do not bawl, as to be heard above, or distinct from, the rest of the congregation, that you may not destroy the harmony; but strive to unite your voices together, so as to make one clear melodious sound.

Sing in time. Whatever time is sung, be sure to keep with it. Do not run before, not stay behind it; but attend closely to the leading voices, and move therewith as exactly as you can. And take care you sing not too slow.

Above all, sing spiritually. Have an eye to God in every word you sing. Aim at pleasing Him more than yourself, or any other creature. In order to do this, attend strictly to the sense of what you sing, and see that your heart is not carried away with the sound, but offered to God continually; so shall your singing be such as the Lord will approve of here, and reward when he cometh in the clouds of heaven.
