Baptism: If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Rector's Desk

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Monday the 9th I'll be heading off to Ucluelet, Tofino and Ahousaht and offering the only Masses they'll have in those communities for the entire month of February. One doesn't need to travel far to enter 'mission' territory on the Island. As the West Coast Parish hasn't had a pastor for a number of years, a faithful young local woman named Katherine is the Bishop's administrator and has requested I offer a Spanish Mass for the Latinos working in the communities who hardly speak English and would be encouraged by at least my 'attempt' to pray in their language. She's also asking me to celebrate a Mass for the faithful in Ucluelet as well as make a pastoral visit to Ahousaht that requires a water taxi ride from Tofino. I consider this a mission of sacramental love from the Cathedral to our 'family' in faith on the West Coast and made possible in part by the Lord's provision of priestly service in my absence of Frs. Sean, Bernard and Claude. I'll also be calling on Dcn. Philip to prepare a Sunday homily on the 15th to relieve me from the sacred duty of preparing while I'm away. I continue to thank the Lord for terrific clerical and lay assistance to support the Lord's work here at St. Andrew's.

This mission takes many forms and I was called upon to offer sacramental assistance this past weekend to children who live with their family in a country where the faith is outlawed and finding 'underground' priests that speak English impossible. This coming weekend, I'll be hearing the first confessions of our older children's catechism class; one of three that's capably led by wonderful catechists who really work hard to inspire our children. The freedom to worship is a gift and last Saturday we had two extraordinary occasions for a morning fellowship following adoration for men, and in the evening young adults. It's all quite inspiring to hear how the Lord is working in so many lives.

We should all start noticing the signs of our interior paint/plaster project inside the Cathedral. It's a significant undertaking and will disrupt things for about three months but as the last painting was over 50 years ago, we're overdue. We have budgeted \$400,000.00 from our reserved funds as approved by both Parish and Diocesan authorities. We're grateful for the generosity of parishioners past and present and welcome contributions to this beautification of our Mother Church. Ash Wednesday and Lent are just around the corner and it's not too early to be thinking of a Lenten disciplines along the line of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Remember Ash

Wednesday is a day of fasting from food and abstaining from meat. While old enough to be exempted from the fast, I happily will offer a little sacrifice for Jesus who gave his very self for us!

Finally, I leave you with some thoughts on the important subject of stewardship:

"Practicing stewardship intimately ties us to who we are as a Christian people. Stewardship is an expression of faith. It is not simply the church's way of raising money; rather, it is a spiritual discipline that encompasses our very being as Christians. It is a radical departure from our secular understanding of charity where we give to an external need. Instead, as stewards, we are motivated to give because it is something we internally need to do; it is intrinsic to our very understanding of what it means to be fully human. Giving is not predicated on a certain act, nor is it something we do just because it is convenient. Our vocation as a Christian is that we give freely and in great generosity *"for God loves a cheerful giver"* (2Corinthians 9:7). Recognising that God actually gave us everything we have in trust, we, in turn, share the gifts that we have been given." Peace in Christ,

"Break Free"

Break free from the addictive cycles of lust, pornography and sexual addiction. This Spring, St Andrews Cathedral is offering a men's ministry called **Break Free** that is designed to help men find freedom from sins of lust and discover the beauty of God's plan for sexual intimacy.

From previous participants:

"Break Free has taught me that no matter how low you go in your addiction, there is always hope. I've learned that no matter how much I stumble, I can trust in the Lord to lift me back up."

"Break free has been really helpful in my journey towards purity and chastity. It gives you a perspective that helps you find the root of your struggle, and how to let God heal that part of yourself. Equally important, it provides a community of people with similar struggles and aspirations, who can journey with you. I would highly recommend it to anyone seeking to grow in chastity."

According to the Barna Group/Pure Desire Ministries, 74% of men in the church view pornography on a regular basis. Break Free is a group that every man should attend to be equipped with the tools needed to finish strong. Chains are broken and lives can be restored. Discover how to renew your mind and break destructive patterns.

Break Free will meet at St. Andrew's Cathedral (Mother Theresa Lounge) in a small-group format to provide a safe, anonymous space for men to be accountable to each other. This is a place where single or married men over the age of 19 can come together for support and acceptance.

We will go through a 12-week curriculum that will cover:

- *Conquer Series: The Battle Plan for Purity* (trailer, <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=--zNEGkXBwU>),
- *Forged: 33 Days Toward Freedom* (Jason Everet, <https://chastity.com/products/forged/>)
- *Theology of the Body* (St John Paul II) that provides proven principals and practical tools to help you to reform your mind and walk with sexual integrity.

What is Intercessory Prayer?

Intercessory prayer is a vital practice in the Christian faith. It involves praying on behalf of others. This gift allows believers to support one another spiritually. Through intercession, prayers become a powerful tool for change.

Intercessory prayer means praying specifically for others. Unlike personal prayer, where one asks God for their own needs or guidance, intercession focuses entirely on the needs of the person asking for prayer. It is an act of love and compassion, showing concern for the well-being of others. Intercessors stand in the gap between God and those they pray for, acting as spiritual advocates. This kind of prayer is often persistent and filled with faith, trusting that God hears and responds.



Ash Wednesday

We will celebrate 2 Masses on Ash Wednesday: one at 12:00 pm and one at 7:00 pm.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence throughout the universal church. Fridays of Lent are also compulsory days of abstinence throughout the universal church. In Canada, Catholics may substitute an act of charity in place of abstinence (but not fasting). However, it is strongly encouraged that some form of penitential discipline be undertaken.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. **Abstinence** is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fasting and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance.

Homebound Ministry



The Homebound Ministry is looking for volunteers who can bring the Lord to our homebound parishioners, either in their own homes or at a care home facility. We currently have 20 volunteers serving about 70 parishioners. Volunteers must have a love for the Eucharist and have the skill to listen to those they visit. Please pray about this ministry.
