## **Keeping the Faith**

We are very fortunate to live in a country where we can practice our faith without fear of persecution. Christians in many other countries are not so lucky, facing discrimination, church closures destruction, desecration of Christian symbols of worship, torture and even execution.

For example, human rights organizations report that Christians in North Korea could be imprisoned for simply owning a Bible or gathering for worship. We do not think much about the suffering of Christians in other places because here in Canada we are safe.

And yet, in some ways, even while living here, truly living the faith can be an uphill struggle. While laws protect our practice of religion, many parts of our society today have no use for religion. We are bombarded every day with messaging that promotes ambition, self-development, achievement and success, about advancing in this world. Messaging about what are important in our faith: kindness, generosity, self-sacrifice, is drowned out by exhortations to be better and stronger and have more and more. The Cross is not a model many look to.

On a more personal level - although many of us live with friends or family who are also devoted to the faith, some of our loved ones do not share our beliefs. It can be lonely going to mass and/or praying alone. We can get disheartened and drop out of religious practice altogether, losing out on the community that is there for us at every mass.

It is good to remember Jesus' assurance: "....not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives." (Luke 21:18-19) Before these comforting words, Jesus reminds the crowd that the time will come when the temple where they are gathered will come down, with no stone left.

We may not succeed in this world. We can lose everything. We may be alone. We do not stop loving and believing because we know we are safe with Jesus.

## From the Desk of Respect Life Ministry and Father Claude

The genocide against Christians in Congo and Nigeria: the evidence that no one talks about | Zenit The World Seen from Rome.

On November 15th Aid to the Church in Need,(ACN) focuses on the Global Cry for Religious Freedom. Currently, an estimated 327 million Christians worldwide live in countries where religious persecution is rampant. They are at risk of being attacked, arrested, imprisoned, tortured, and, in the worst cases, killed, solely on the basis of their beliefs. \* It is also estimated that 75 percent of religiously motivated violence targets Christians, possibly making them the most persecuted religious group in the world. Diocese of Victoria.

Facts: According to the Catholic Bishops' Conference of Nigeria (CBCN), at least 145 priests have been kidnapped, 11 have been murdered, and four remain missing since 2015. However, Intersociety claims the reality is much worse. According to its counts, at least 250 Catholic clergy have been attacked in addition to another 350 clergy from other denominations. The Catholic World report 3 churches devastated every day in Nigeria.

Furthermore, the report estimates that from the Boko Haram uprising in July 2009 to September of this year, 19,100 Christian churches in Nigeria have been destroyed, looted, or violently closed, representing an average of 1,200 churches per year, 100 per month, or more than three per day. The Genocost in Africa especially in the DRC (Democratic Republic of Congo) is a genocide due to politico-economic massacre. The Multinational and other powerful countries around the world are using Rwanda and Uganda to destabilize the country especially at the east where they found all the mineral wanted to build electric cars, cellphones even military weapons.


