## Sacramental Information

**Baptism:** If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

**Marriage:** Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

**Funeral:** Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

Pray for an increase in holy vocations in our diocese and for the courage to say "yes" when God calls.

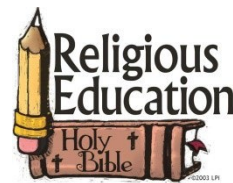

## From the Rector's Desk

11<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

June 14<sup>th</sup> 2026

Our former Bishop, and by God's good grace, the one Christ used to ordain me in 2007, was in fine form as our retreat guide and speaker at the Benedictine Abbey of Westminster this past weekend. Forty parishioners of the Cathedral and Our Lady of the Rosary, young and not so young (a sweet little baby enjoyed his first retreat), were blessed and inspired by talks by retired Archbishop Richard Gagnon on the 'Call to Holiness', 'Rekindling the Faith through Prayer', and 'Mary our Model of Fidelity'. Combined with the worship of both the monks, and our own celebration of Mass, plentiful food and rest, and the personalized combination of solitude with the Lord and fellowship with friends, the teaching was powerful and fruitful. After over 45 years of organizing and offering retreats and holy pilgrimages, it was a kind of reality check to hear Bishop Richard say that the vast majority of Catholics will never experience the joy in Jesus that comes from travel in communion for holy purposes. Shocking to me! If you've never had the privilege, put a retreat or pilgrimage on your 'bucket list'. I'm grateful to Patrica Cuthbertson for outstanding administrative assistance, and Paul Davis for fearlessly driving the bus to the mainland. Next year: June 4-6 on a first come first served basis.

Thank you to the ten people who responded to my survey about the desire for a second morning Mass celebrated Wednesdays through Fridays with Fr. Claude. According to the results there would be so few consistently attending each day that I have to conclude that now is NOT the right time to implement an additional Mass. I have heard some express interest in gathering for the office of Morning Prayer which would be far simpler as it requires lay leadership and less essential liturgical support. I wonder? May God's will be done! Speaking of Fr. Claude, he's due back on the 12th, but with what is written in the news, I suspect he might have to isolate (due to the Ebola outbreak in the Congo where he has family) in his Ladysmith Rectory for three weeks. Join me in continuing to pray for him and the people of Congo. Friday the 12th is the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the World Day of Prayer for Sanctification of Priests. Frs. Sean, Claude and Bernard welcome and appreciate your continued prayerful support and encouragement.

This Saturday was my last event with Young Adults (18-30) for the summer. We gathered after Mass for a continuation of the Study of the Book of Acts. On last week's priest's retreat some coordinating for World Youth July/August 2027 in Seoul Korea proved helpful. The Diocese has asked Fr. Joseph Yuson to be Chaplain to the

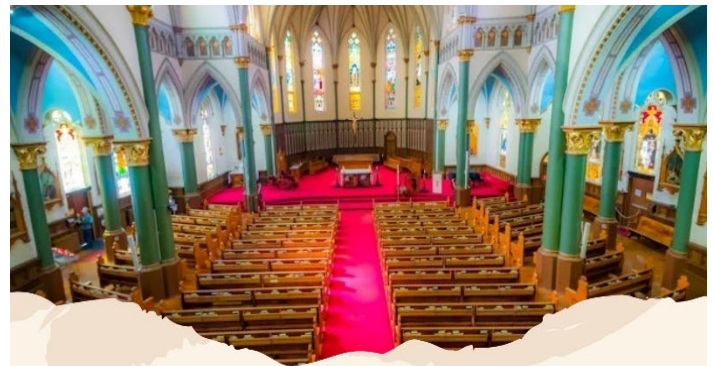
enormously inspiring event. Details are to be forthcoming, but I'd ask young adults (19-35) to prayerfully consider attending from the Cathedral Parish.

Thanks for all your varied supports, financial and volunteer that makes such beautiful mission and ministry happen at St. Andrew's.

## Being a Missionary in Your Own Parish

In Pope Leo's new encyclical, *Magnifica Humanitas*, he reminds us of the great (in fact, magnificent) dignity of every human person because they have been willed, created, and loved by God — a dignity which no amount of sin, failure, humiliation, or exclusion can diminish. We are created in the image of God, who is *relational*: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in an eternal giving of love. What does that mean for us? It means we too are “called to communion with God and can fully discover our true selves *only in sincere self-giving*,” as Pope Leo explains.

(1) Because of our baptism, each of us is given the added dignity of *being entrusted by Jesus Christ to actively carry on his mission* in our specific place and time.

(2) Each specific person you may encounter has the dignity that says *they're worth the mission*.

We don't have to go to a distant country to be a missionary — you can be a missionary right here in your own parish. All are called to the mission, but as St. Paul teaches, *there are many gifts, but one Spirit*. In other words, there are lots of different ways to use the unique gifts God has given you to help others to find Christ's love in the Church. A couple of specific needs we have right now are:

**Catechists:** If you're gifted in teaching little ones, helping them to learn about God's love and prepare for the sacraments of Reconciliation, Confirmation, and First Holy Communion is a wonderful way to help bring them closer to Christ. Think about joining our team of catechists and helping to co-lead a class!

**RCIA Sponsors:** Many adults seeking to become Catholic will be starting the RCIA program this fall. They'll each need a sponsor who will accompany them through this journey at the weekly Thursday evening sessions as a fellow imperfect person who loves Christ, help guide them in the Catholic life, and above all pray for them.

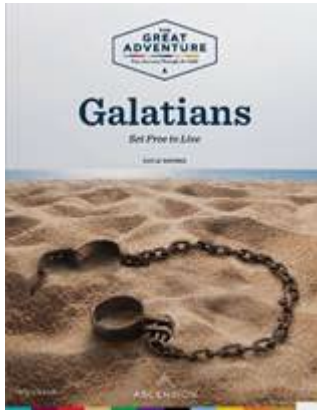

#### The risk of the technocratic paradigm

- Efficiency → ⚠ becomes the sole criterion

- Is fast and powerful

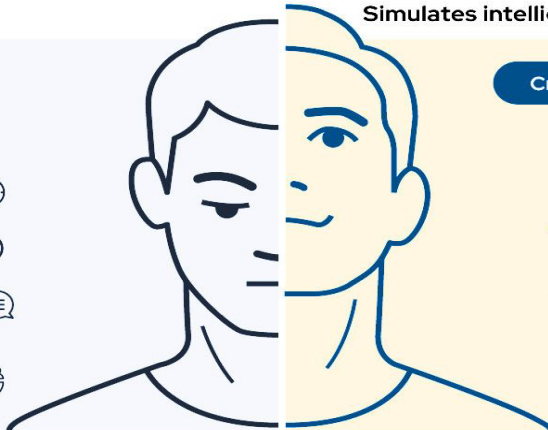

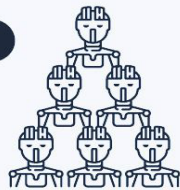
