Baptism: If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Rector's Desk

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

I came across this Wendell Berry poem last week and thought it might speak to many of us who are wearied by the 'changes and chances of this fleeting world'. Certainly, as I attempt to offer spiritual solidity to many whose lives are upended by chronic illness, geographical immigration uncertainty, mental anxieties, habitual sins, sudden and tragic death, leaning in on both supernatural and natural reality brings a certain peace. In my own life a daily discipline of rooting down in sacrament, soil and sea provides both God's peace and fortitude in service of the gospel of Christ. I pray we all find meaningful daily devotional foundations for our lives.

Ordinarily I wouldn't be thinking and planning a year in advance, but Cathedral ministry demands it. As I write today, ministry opportunity in November of 2027 requires some decision making. At the same time, a couple planning their wedding for next summer (one of 8 weddings planned for 2027 already) has been in touch about getting together for a visit this weekend.

The Parish Council and Finance Committee meet this coming week and will be looking at both program and budget requirements for 2027. I'm really praying about Christmas worship and mission opportunities and the possibility of another devotional book, gift mission using Matthew Kelly's "33 Days of Miracles, Wonders, and Grace." But in the immediate calendar, this weekend we'll enjoy a first of its kind 'Ministry Fair' to raise awareness of the fantastic service our volunteers offer the wider community, and increase opportunity for those of you seeking a means of serving Jesus.

One of our parish goals is that everyone would be involved in a small group fellowship beyond the minimal obligation of Sunday Mass. And while I think of it, here are 3 areas of need I'm pondering and praying about that won't be represented at the fair: the need for building and grounds expertise, bookkeeping and accounting maintenance, and stewardship development.

All for the greater glory of God. *Ad maiorem Dei gloriam*

The Prayer of Forgiveness

*Bring to your prayer a person you need or want to forgive.
Try to maintain a contemplative attitude.*

1. In your own words, tell God what hurt you the most. Share with God, as with a close friend, whatever emotions come to you.
2. Ask God to forgive the person who has hurt/is hurting you.
3. Ask God for the grace to forgive this person yourself. Ask for the grace to see this person as God sees the person. If you really don't want to forgive or can't forgive, ask God to give you at least the grace to want to forgive.
4. Put the person you are trying to forgive into Jesus' hands. Give God all the anger, hurt, resentment that you feel. You don't have to feel bad if you can't do this all at once.
5. Make the decision to forgive. Your prayer may be:
"Gracious God, I choose to forgive _____."

If you experience significant movement and grace coming out of the above prayer, you may at some later time be ready to move to another stage:

6. Thank God for all that you went through, perhaps even the pain that was caused. Not because the experience itself was good. But because you believe the God desires to bring something good out of evil, to bring healing to the very painful experience you had. Close with some prayer of thanksgiving.

Forgiveness does not mean that you "accept" or even go back to an abusive relationship. To respect and protect your core, your self, you need to be able to establish and keep appropriate boundaries.

Do not hurry from one step to the next. Let God do the work. Forgiveness is a grace, though you can dispose yourself to receive God's loving care for you.

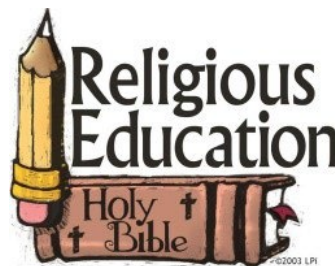

Sacramental Preparation 2026-27 Registration Open!



Registration is now open for the 2026-27 year of Sacramental Preparation! Children at least 7 years old and teens will receive weekly catechesis to help nurture them in the faith and grow as a community

while preparing to receive the grace of the sacraments of Reconciliation (Confession), Eucharist (1st Communion), and Confirmation.

Our sacramental preparation program is designed as a two-year program running from fall into the spring. Children in Year 1 will prepare for the sacrament of Reconciliation, then in Year 2 they will prepare for the reception of their First Communion as well as Confirmation. Teens will prepare for any sacraments they may have missed in a separate one-year program.

A Catholic Perspective of Steadfast Hope expressed with Gentleness and Respect

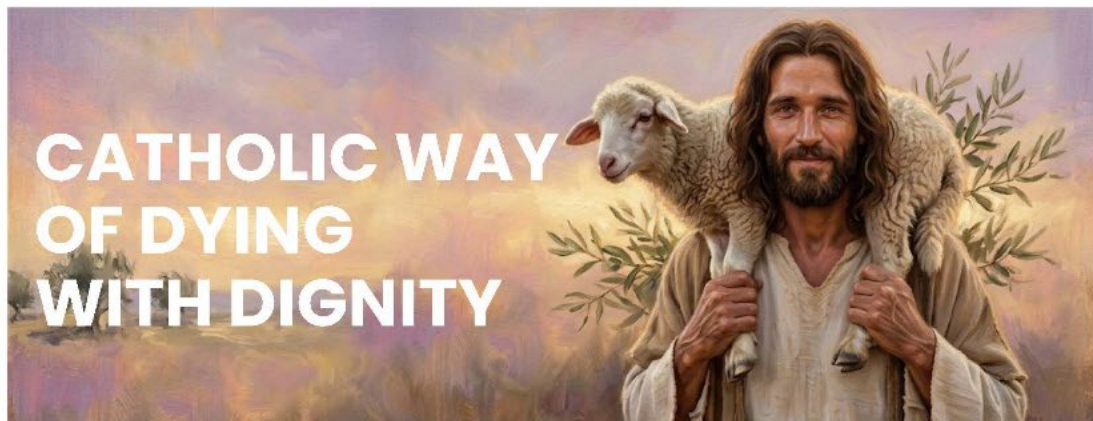
Sept 23 to Nov 25 – 10 weeks

St. Peter instructs believers to honor Christ as Lord and always be ready to explain their faith, stating: "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect". 1 Peter 3:15

Have you ever felt you had an opportunity to say something about your faith or the God you serve or His Catholic and Apostolic Church here on earth, but you could not find the words and then the moment passed? Perhaps this course may be the beginning for your leap of faith to "be prepared to give answer" and calling on the Holy Spirit, to find your voice.

Course consists of 10 sessions. Classes will generally be 1.5 hr long, held on Wednesdays, beginning September 23rd and finishing November 25th.

Two options for attendance are offered - 2PM in-person at Parish Centre or 6:30PM on zoom video meeting. Facilitator is Bernadette O'Connor. Registration required at Parish Office. Cost is \$25 for course handouts.
