Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

✠ Prayer for Vocations

Heavenly Father, bless your Church with an abundance of holy and zealous priests, deacons, brothers and sisters. Give those you have called to the married state, and those you have chosen to live as single persons in the world, the special graces that their lives require. Form us all in the likeness of your Son so that in him, with him and through him we may love you more deeply and serve you more faithfully always and everywhere. With Mary we ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Good Friday Fasting/Abstinence

Good Friday (April 3rd) is a day of fast and abstinence throughout the universal church. In Canada, Catholics may substitute an act of charity in place of abstinence. However, it is strongly encouraged that some form of penitential discipline be undertaken. Abstinence is observed by all people 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Fasting is to be observed by all people 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

From the Rector's Desk

Palm/Passion Sunday – Holy Week

I'm writing from the Oak Bay Beach Hotel lobby because for social reasons, I've been temporarily evicted from my home nearby. The contrast of the peace, comfort and tranquility compared to the wars, tragedy, destruction and death in so many places in the world is spiritually unnerving. It's hard not to feel impotent, and yet we must press on with faith, hope and love. It was a small but significant participation in Christ's incarnational sacrificial love for the world, that I was called to offer sacraments in hospital as a former lapsed parishioner prepares for death. Similarly, today, I'll be offering graveside prayers for a distraught out of province family who left planning final arrangements far too late. In all this, and so much else we all do as 'Church' we extend the sacramental merciful presence of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection for the love of the world. Which brings me to Holy Week.

As much as I might prepare, I never feel ready for Holy Week. The staff, volunteers, clergy and I will pour over a dizzying array of liturgical detail to offer our best worship to God at this week's Christ Mass and next week's Triduum. Holy to be sure, but it's also a bit of a harried week. Combined with the liturgical detail, we must attend to the crucially important spiritual and pastoral preparations for our 'elect' readying for immersion in baptism and sacraments of initiation, as well as assisting those preparing for their first confessions prior to confirmation into the 'fold' of the 'one, holy, catholic and apostolic' Church. (18 to be baptized compared with 5 last year; and 15 to be confirmed as candidates previously baptized outside the Catholic Church compared to 7 last year). This is the culmination of over a year of practicing the evangelistic gifts of hospitality and friendship (often initiated in the pews at Sunday Mass) leading so many to seek full communion with Christ and his Church through the formation of heart and mind in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. We already have many waiting in the wings for the next RCIA to commence in September and I call all the faithful to pray to the Lord of the harvest for workers (catechists, evangelists and disciple making sponsors) to assist this foundational work of Christ. These neophytes have been reminded by Bishop Gary that their immersion into the Church is to join with Jesus in sacrificial service of some kind. All of us ought to be involved as stewards of God's grace and gifts, to give ourselves in some ministry and be incorporated into the parish through a 'little family' group where we're known and loved and can know and love others. While we try to offer an array of opportunities based upon volunteer initiative, occasionally experiments do not succeed. One such occasion is the

monthly 'family pot luck' so faithfully served by the Collins family and yet did not get tremendous numerical traction. Thanks for all who serve the parish for the sake of Christ. We live and learn while trying to keep in step with the Spirit of God.

The last Saturday of the month has become an occasion for a holy hour of Adoration after the 5:00 p.m. Saturday Mass and Palm/Passion Sunday will be no exception. While all are welcome, young adults will be invited by their leaders to a social in the Parish Centre. Good Friday will include the usual Solemn Liturgy at 3:00 but there will be a children's liturgy of the Word with Veneration of the Cross at 11:00 and a 7:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross. I'll be leading the Children's liturgy and because of the paint/restoration project will forgo a Stations of the Cross this year. There will be readings of the Word, Children's Homily, Prayers, Veneration and Distribution of Holy Communion.



Michael, Laura and Solace Newman were blessed on the Solemnity of the Annunciation as Michael received the sacrament of Confirmation, and they celebrated the convalidation of their marriage. Laura is eager to begin RCIA in September and follow Christ into the Church through the sacraments of initiation

Respect Life Ministry – Update

Holy Week Blessings – Empty Me, Fill Me, Use Me.

I have been doing a 40-day Lenten retreat with Hallow and have found it profoundly fruitful. I am struck by the compassion, acceptance, and love that all the guides share as they lead us through the central theme and prayer: *“Empty Me, Fill Me, Use Me.”* This is a personally very profound and meaningful prayer.

The retreat has offered many powerful insights, particularly in understanding the sad reality of how sin is often replaced with excuses, minimizing its consequences, or even denying that certain choices absolutely lead to sin.

This has required us to hold ourselves accountable for our choices, leading us to pray: *“Empty me, Lord. Fill me with your heart and your love. Use me, Lord.”*

The session this past Tuesday brought us to a key reality: Love is not sentimental. True love always brings us face-to-face with who we are before Christ, who is all-merciful, all-loving, and all-forgiving. However, He never imposes any of this upon us—we must go freely to Christ. It is we who refuse to take a look at sin in our lives. Christ does not coerce, He invites.

The Catholic Church tells us that there will come a moment when every one of us will stand before Christ himself. 1039 “In the presence of Christ, who is truth itself, the truth of each man’s relationship with God will be laid bare. The Last Judgment will reveal even to its furthest consequences the good each person has done or failed to do during his earthly life. All that the wicked do is recorded, and they do not know. When ‘our God comes, he does not keep silence’. He will turn towards those at his left hand. I placed my poor little ones on earth for you. I, as their head, was seated in heaven at the right had of my Father- but on earth, my members were suffering. My members on earth were in need. If you gave anything to my members, what you gave would reach their Head. Would that you had known that my little ones were in need when I placed them on earth for you and appointed them as your stewards to bring your good works into my treasure. But you have placed nothing in their hands. Therefore, you have found nothing in my presence”. Let us enter Holy Week with the Grace to pray Empty me, Fill me, Use me. Blessed Holy Week.

From the Desk of Cardinal Leo, AD of Toronto

Bill C218 (condensed)

As you know, our faith teaches us that every human life is sacred — from conception to natural death. Each person is created in the image and likeness of God. No suffering, however profound, ever diminishes that dignity. I am also keenly aware of the pain and anguish of mental illness that has touched the lives of so many parishioners, family members, colleagues and loved ones.

I write today to invite you to visit HelpNotHarmCanada.ca and contact your Member of Parliament (MP) in support of Bill C-218, a private members’ bill that would amend the Criminal Code to prevent Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) when mental illness is the sole underlying condition. The entire process should take no more than three minutes. Tragically, euthanasia in our country has expanded at an alarming rate – we must elevate our voices to halt further harm, fostering a culture of life and loving support to care for one another.

Time is of the essence. Bill C-218 is scheduled for second reading in early April 2026, with a vote expected by mid-April. Without this legislation, the law will expand to provide MAiD for those with mental illness as the sole underlying condition as of March 17, 2027.

Mental illness is real and deeply painful. Yet important truths must guide us:

- A desire to die can be a symptom of mental illness itself.
- Mental illness is often treatable, and recovery remains possible.
- Serious gaps in mental health care support persist in Canada.
- Those who suffer are frequently among the most vulnerable.

Our response must be love, solidarity, and a steadfast commitment to care. We are called to offer help, not harm; hope, not despair; protection, not abandonment.

Advocating for laws that protect life is a meaningful expression of our faith in action — most especially during this Lenten journey, a time of prayer, fasting and alms giving.

Let us pray for our elected officials, that they may be guided by wisdom and courage. May we also hold close in prayer all who live with mental illness and their families, that they may receive compassionate care and renewed hope. Thank you for your kind consideration of my request. Be assured of my prayers for you and your loved ones.
