A New Order

In today's Gospel John is in prison - sent there by Herod because he had condemned Herod's unlawful marriage to Herodias. This was John who had proclaimed that he was the messenger, the one who, as Isaiah had foretold, would make way for the Lord. By this time John had already preached to multitudes, baptizing them and calling on everyone to repent because the kingdom of Heaven was at hand. This was John who had seen the Holy Spirit descend on Jesus like a dove, and recognized Him as the Son of God. This time he is in a dark cell. He cannot see how Jesus' ministry is progressing. And so he asks his disciples to confirm that Jesus is indeed He "who is to come."

Jesus tells the disciples to go back to John and tell John what they have seen - strange healings, miraculous events. The reports are not about victories in battle, kingdoms overthrown, rulers vanquished. They are quiet events: a blind man suddenly able to see, lepers healed, the lame suddenly able to walk.

If you had the job of explaining to someone why Jesus is Lord, what would you say? Because our Lord is not a wildly impressive figure who has the trappings of power and glory. In fact, we see Him every day, hanging on a Cross. Where is the glory in that?

John did not live long enough to be there for the Crucifixion, but if his disciples had gone back to him and reported that Jesus had died on a Cross, would John have been satisfied that indeed, this was the Son of God?

The answer may be in the last lines of today's Gospel. Jesus gives this strange message that John is great, but "even the least in the kingdom is greater than he." There is a new order, Jesus is saying. Your old ideas of power and glory are no more; His is the Kingdom of love, sacrifice, emptiness, strength in weakness. John likely would have smiled.



From the Rector's Desk 3rd Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday of Advent December 14th 2025

Unbeknownst to most, we have a fairly steady ministry of nuptial Masses and sacramental validations of civil unions that take place outside of our primary Sunday Mass assembly. There's one coming up this weekend, and there was another joyful occasion last Friday. The bride and groom from last weekend's celebration are members of the Cathedral but hail from another province, where their parents landed as immigrants and refugees years ago; hence the 100 or so friends and family were mostly from out of province. It gave me great joy in particular to see the bride's family from Rwanda, who would have experienced something of unspeakable loss and suffering in their home country's genocide, rejoice at such an occasion for a new beginning in the love of Christ. God bless them all. Another cause for joy this week is we've been able to offer some practical help to our Ahousaht First Nation friends who live in Victoria. A friend who is a band council member needs an easy access location to be able to distribute Christmas assistance to his people and they'll be able to use our Parish Centre library on Saturday. It's all part of 'truth, reconciliation and friendship building'.... Rejoice!

At the time of writing, we've been able to distribute 5 \$300 Hillside Gift cards to families of the parish who could use a little Christmas help, as well as a \$100 card for a senior who's asked for one. This is simply our attempt this year to distribute the accumulated funds intended for those in need and offer assistance to our 'household of faith'. There are lots of cards still to offer... the only criteria are that you be a registered member of the parish and have need of one. That's it! What a joy to be part of a loving parish family. Speaking of which, one 'small group' that we're trying to cultivate in the large parish family, is that of the staff who gather each week for an information sharing and support meeting. Last Sunday, Linda and I hosted in our home some 14 members of the staff with their spouses, including Bishop Gary, for an Advent social. Besides the blessing of good food, drink and conversation, we teamed up for a competitive game of Christmas trivia. My team came third of three teams. But I rejoice anyway! I hope you've been enjoying the Advent 'witness' talks from those in our RCIA formation program who have answered the question 'What draws you to Christ and the Catholic Church?'. Each has such an impressive and inspiring story of the powerful reality of Christ's presence and love in the Church. Alleluia.

As mentioned previously on numerous occasions, the signs of social distress amidst homelessness, drug trafficking/addictions, and mental health episodes are getting more pronounced and disruptively stressful for soup kitchen and Cathedral staff and volunteers. We've also received two letters from neighbor businesses complaining about the effect of social disorder on their personal wellbeing and business viability. This is serious. This week we've booked two meetings for consultations on our varied security needs; both inside and outside our property, as well as day and night time stressors. One meeting is with the Commissionaires and another with the Victoria Police Department. We are endeavouring to stay open to meet the spiritual needs of all, including the most vulnerable, while keeping everyone safe and happy. Needless to say, it's not easy. I'll keep you posted.

The Canadian Bishops Speak out on BILL C-9 An Act to amend the Criminal Code

The Canadian Government is debating an amendment to the Criminal Code to eliminate the religious exemption clause from Canada's hate speech legislation in Section 319 (3) (b) of the Criminal Code. The current provision in the Criminal Code slated for removal states: (3) No person shall be convicted of an offence under subsection (2) [...] (b) if, in good faith, the person expressed or attempted to establish by an argument an opinion on a religious subject or an opinion based on a belief in a religious text." While the Church clearly condemns hatred and violence, as does our founder, the Bishops state: "the proposed elimination of the 'good faith' religious-text defence risks that clergy, educators, and others may fear that the expression of traditional moral or doctrinal teachings could be misinterpreted as hate speech and could subject the speaker to proceedings that threaten imprisonment of up to two years..."

What can you do? Take a few moments to read the letter from the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops expressing their deep concern regarding Bill C-9 which is found in the bulletin. I share the Bishop's grave concern with the amendment and its interference with our religious freedom and freedom of expression and therefore urge you to write to our Federal Member of Parliament for Victoria, The Hon. Re: Proposed Restrictions on Religious Freedom – Bill C-9

Dear Prime Minister Carney,

On behalf of the Permanent Council of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), we write to you today to express deep concern regarding recent reports that your government, in co-operation with the Bloc Québécois, plans to remove the long-standing religious exemption in Section 319(3)(b) of the *Criminal Code* as part of Bill C-9 amendments.¹

We recognize and unequivocally affirm the importance of condemning hatred, protecting vulnerable people and communities, and fostering a society in which every Canadian can live free from discrimination, intimidation, and violence. The Church has consistently supported appropriate measures to confront extremism and the promotion of hatred. We also understand the serious challenges that have emerged in recent years, including the increase in antisemitism and other forms of hateful speech and behaviours, many of which have targeted the Christian community. These actions leave a deep wound on the fabric of our country.

At the same time, the proposed elimination of the "good faith" religious-text defence raises significant concerns. This narrowly framed exemption has served for many years as an essential safeguard to ensure that Canadians are not criminally prosecuted for their sincere, truth-seeking expression of beliefs made without animus and grounded in long-standing religious traditions. Courts have made clear that only the most extreme forms of speech fall within the scope of hate-propaganda offences.

However, the removal of this provision risks creating uncertainty for faith communities, clergy, educators, and others who may fear that the expression of traditional moral or doctrinal teachings could be misinterpreted as hate speech and could subject the speaker to proceedings that threaten imprisonment of up to two years. As legal experts have noted, the public's understanding of hate-speech and its legal implications are often far broader than what the *Criminal Code* actually captures. Eliminating a clear statutory safeguard will likely therefore have a chilling effect on religious expression, even if prosecutions remain unlikely in practice.

¹ Criminal Code, RSC 1985, c C-46, s 319(3)(b): "No person shall be convicted of an offence under subsection (2) [...] (b) if, in good faith, the person expressed or attempted to establish by an argument an opinion on a religious subject or an opinion based on a belief in a religious text".

We are also mindful that the existing defence has been supported not only by Christian organizations, but also by civil liberties advocates who view it as an important component of Canada's constitutional commitment to freedom of religion, freedom of expression, and pluralism. Respect for these freedoms is not only a constitutional requirement but a foundational element of our national identity. The *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms* declares Canada to be "a free and democratic society".

For these reasons, we respectfully urge the Government of Canada:

• To ensure Bill C-9 does not remove the religious-text defence from the *Criminal Code*.

Or alternatively:

- To provide clear assurance through a public statement including in any legislative record or parliamentary debate that good-faith religious expression, teaching, and preaching will not be subject to criminal prosecution under the hate-propaganda provisions; and
- To commit to broad consultation with religious leaders, legal experts, and civilliberties organizations before any amendments are made to Bill C-9 that would affect religious freedom.

We believe it is possible to achieve the shared objective of promoting a society free from genuine hatred while also upholding the constitutional rights of millions of Canadians who draw moral and spiritual guidance from their faith traditions.

We share these concerns in a spirit of dialogue and mutual respect, and we remain committed to working constructively with the government to ensure that legislation aimed at reducing hate does not inadvertently undermine the freedoms that sustain a healthy, diverse, and democratic Canada.




