Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Desk of Fr. Claude

My Journey of Faith and Family in Three Amazing Moments

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

It has been almost two months since I disappeared from Saint Andrew's and All Saints communities. I wonder people might ask themselves: "Where is Fr. Claude?" or "What happened to him?" These few words, I hope, will bring answers to your questions. But briefly, the two big reasons of my disappearance are my holiday and my isolation.

The Purpose of my Holiday's Journey

On May 11th, I set off on a major holiday to Europe and Africa with three main goals: to celebrate my sister's wedding in Belgium, visit my family and the Priory in the Congo, and make a personal pilgrimage to Fatima, Portugal, for the feast day of Our Lady of Fatima. My adventure began with my own pilgrimage to Fatima, followed by the visit to Congo, and it ended with my sister's wedding.

A Small Miracle in Fatima

I arrived in Lisbon on May 12th and took a bus to Fatima. Surprisingly I discovered that the guest house I booked for my accommodation was far from the Fatima Sanctuary. Rather than risk being stranded early in the morning or late in the night celebration, I took a leap of faith: so, I canceled the booking after expressing my disappointment to the taxi man. Right then, my taxi driver called his boss, who happened to have a room available in his guesthouse, just a short walk away from the Sanctuary. I felt as though Our Lady herself had prepared the perfect place for me when there were no more chances to find a place.

The Candlelight Vigil

That evening, all the Fatima area was packed with pilgrims, cars, and buses. We prayed the Rosary, and a beautiful candlelit procession began. A long line of priests, bishops, and laypeople followed the statue of Our Lady, singing, and praying into the night. It was an incredibly powerful, luminous experience that finally concluded at 1:00 am.

The Day of the Celebration

The following day, May 13th, the Eucharistic celebration began around 10:30 after the Rosary prayer and the procession of the Blessed Mother from the shrine to the podium prepared for big celebrations in front of the Basilica. This year I was blessed to have a seat in the sanctuary at Mass. In his homily the presiding bishop emphasized the important role of our Blessed Mother in the Church. She prays for us and leads us to Jesus her son and he invited the congregation to pray for our troubled world, citing a few countries in trouble, among these, my country the DR Congo. He also reminded us of our

responsibility as Christians to let our lights shine wherever we are. I believe this was the main message, although my Portuguese is somewhat limited.

What touched me most during this celebration was the deep faith of the immense crowd that had come from all over the world to honor our Blessed Mother. People clapped their hands, waved white scarves, and rejoiced with great enthusiasm and devotion. It was truly moving to witness such a powerful expression of faith.

My Visit to Congo

After Portugal, I travelled through Brussels on my way to the Democratic Republic of Congo. The flight was not full at all, and I arrived in Kinshasa on the evening of May 16. Some of my confreres kindly came to welcome me at the airport and took me to the Monastery, where I spent a few days with them.

I was blessed to participate in the second part of my retreat with the confreres. The theme focused on the Blessed Mother and her influence in our religious and priestly lives, offering us a time of prayer, reflection, and spiritual renewal. After four days, I travelled to the town where I grew up, situated five hundred kilometers from the Capital. I stayed with one of my nephews for almost a week. One of the Sundays I was excited to concelebrate Mass at my home town Cathedral. Many people no longer recognized me, and only a few knew who I was. In some ways, I felt like a stranger in my hometown. Nevertheless, I was very happy to be reunited with my family and to enjoy once again the natural foods of my childhood, especially the delicious papayas and pineapples grown locally and weighing almost four kilos. At the end of the week, I took the bus back to Kinshasa where I spent three days with my family. After this precious time together, I travelled back to Belgium on June 1st and stayed for a week at my sister's house helping in her wedding preparation. Her wedding celebration was scheduled on June 6th in Saint Paul Parish at the city of Alost; this day was also the feast day of our founder Saint Norbert.

The Wedding Celebration

The wedding Mass started at 1:00 pm. We were three priests: Father Lambert, the parish priest and main celebrant, Father Theo and myself, concelebrants. Father Theo and I grew up together. The parish priest organized the celebration in such a way that all three of us could actively participate in the wedding ceremony. I welcomed the couple at the beginning of the celebration and received their consent at Mass. The Mass was celebrated according to the Congolese Rite. It was a joyful and vibrant celebration, filled with singing and dancing. I was deeply moved to see family members and friends coming from different parts of the world, many of whom I had not seen for a very long time. In fact, I met more friends from my

hometown at the wedding than I had seen during my stay there.

The reception was very well organized. There was plenty of food and drink for everyone, and we celebrated together with great joy, dancing and sharing in the happiness of the newly married couple. The following afternoon, my sister and her husband invited friends from our hometown for lunch. We spent a wonderful time together, sharing memories from our youth, telling stories, and enjoying one another's company before everyone returned to their homes.

Return to Canada

When my time in Belgium came to an end, I flew to Lisbon to catch my flight back to Canada. Upon my arrival, I was asked to meet with a public health officer because I had recently visited my home country. At that time, there were reports of an Ebola outbreak in Ituri, a city in the Democratic Republic of Congo where conflict continues. However, Ituri is located more than 2000 kilometers from Kinshasa, the capital city where I stayed. For the safety of everyone, I was required to cooperate with Canadian public health authorities and complete a twenty-one-day isolation period.

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to Bishop Gary, Father Dean, our Chancellor Theresa, Margaret, to Saint Andrew's Parishioners and the team at All Saints who arranged a place for my isolation and have provided such generous care and support throughout this time.

Being isolated for twenty-one days sounds easy when you hear about it, but it is not always easy to experience. In some ways, I consider myself fortunate. As a monk, I have been trained to live a life that includes periods of silence and solitude, and this has helped me greatly during this time.

I have organized my days around a simple routine: a time for prayer, a time for reading, a time for exercise, and a time for relaxation. I continue to pray the Divine Office each day, and I brought my Mass kit with me so that I can celebrate a private Mass daily. I also brought books to read. To maintain both mental and physical well-being, I exercise regularly. When I begin to feel the weight of isolation, I practice mindfulness. Three times a week I follow a home fitness routine. I also take time to relax, watch soccer, and prepare my own meals.

I am healthy, doing well, and looking forward to seeing you all again next week.

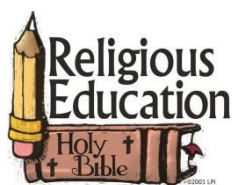


Growth
