When others deride us Lk 23:35-43

At school there was a little boy who could not do the things as well as the other children could. He didn't cry in front of his class as he sat on the bench under a cloud of darkness, but inside, his heart wept. He had adopted the names people called him. Perhaps the class teams were worried that they would not win if he was on their side.

The Gospel today might have been written just for him. Jesus was scoffed at by the leaders. Were they afraid he might be a challenge to their power? They derided him, mocking their conception of his worth, saying,

"He saved others, let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his chosen one."

The good thief is both a wonderful model for our behavior and also a beautiful example of closeness to God. Like him, every one of us needs to treat others in this way. "Fear God, since {...we} are under the same sentence of condemnation."

Each person we ridicule was created by God just like us. They will be judged by God, just as we will. We might not ridicule them with words, but we might judge with our eyes, our gestures, and our snubs.

Why do we judge? Of what are we afraid? Yet, freed from the fear that others would bring us down, how joyful we would be. The little schoolboy would hold hands with the athlete, and darkness would disappear.

O Lord, as you reside in us today, please take away our fears.

From the Rector's Desk

Solemnity of Christ, the King of the Universe: November 23, 2025

As is the beautiful norm, our Cathedral bustles with holy activity each weekend when we gather for Sunday Masses that are the source and summit of our faith. Friday of last weekend, we also hosted the "Beautiful Baroque" concert of the Early Music Society which sold out at 600 tickets. It was a delight not only to enjoy the small exceptionally talented orchestra, but also to wander amongst many in attendance and practice evangelistic hospitality. Admittedly, it's also a little help with our needed revenue stream to fund the operating costs of the Cathedral's mission and ministry. The next night we hosted Fr. Eduardo Santos and parishioners of Our Lady of Fatima (pictured) at the 5:00 p.m. Mass for their Jubilee Year of Hope pilgrimage through the Holy Door of St. Andrew's:



Speaking of our Patron, we're coming up on his Feast on November 30th. (It will be trumped by Advent 1 this year but we'll still acknowledge him). Starting this Saturday, I intend to bless a holy icon of the first Apostle and have it displayed for a daily Novena which will wind down this liturgical year and prayerfully wind us up for the next. As successfully implemented after last year's Sunday Advent Masses, I hope to invite members of the RCIA community seeking reception into full communion to share what draws them to Christ and the Catholic Church. I believe we'll be inspired. Significantly, another initiative was launched after last Sunday's 11:00 a.m. Mass with an invitation to all who wished to be prayed for by one of four trained intercessor teams of two people. This was a holy experiment, to see if the Word and Sacrament of Christ's presence at Mass could extend through the loving community of the baptized in compassionate prayer. Annette and the organizers were pleasantly surprised by the numbers of people who took advantage of the opportunity, but regrettably some weren't able to wait

for their turn. We have every intention to offer this again on December 14, and if volunteers step up, to add the 9:00 a.m. Mass to the 11.

This coming weekend, some of us will attend the Carols of Hope fundraiser for the new Church being constructed for the Our Lady of the Rosary Parish in Langford. A recent drone video of the construction site reveals a big beautiful Church and Hall that will be so welcomed and needed by the rapidly growing community on the Westshore. God bless their efforts to complete this huge undertaking.

This weekend we'll enjoy baptisms at the Saturday 5 p.m. Mass, and a number of adult confirmations at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. Sent out from all the Cathedral Sacramental joy, I'll be off to prison once again to offer the Lord's loving liberating presence in Word and Sacraments to the prisoners at William Head. Next weekend, rather than the usual Young Adult oriented 'Holy Hour', I'd like to invite the community to a meeting with me to discuss leadership and planning in the Parish Centre following the Saturday 5 p.m. Mass. I certainly wouldn't want the elders of our parish to feel neglected, so I invite all of "US" over 65's to a post Mass gathering on Thursday in the Parish Centre for some faithful frivolity.

Finally, thanks to the few people who heard my challenge to get active and service Christ and his mission if not already, who expressed interest in getting involved. Bless you and everyone else.




News from the Diocese

- In recognition of the World Day of the Poor on 16 November 2025, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has issued a pastoral letter by the Episcopal Commission for Justice and Peace titled "Our Daily Bread: Food Security and the Call to Solidarity."
