As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Rector's Mission on the West Coast of Vancouver Island – Ucluelet, Tofino, Ahousaht

6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's the Provincial 'Family Day' holiday on Monday and I hope and pray that you'll take advantage of the occasion to solidify your bonds of familial solidarity. The weekend also includes the cultural celebration of St. Valentine (even though he's been dropped from the Catholic liturgical calendar) and so I hope those married will solidify their holy vows of matrimony upon which all human society rests. 'As the family goes, so goes both the Church and all of civilization'. For the highly important vocation of marriage and family, God bless you all. Like the rest of the nation, I'm only just trying to comprehend the horrendous news of the Tumbler Ridge massacre of children and adults. This is a dark shattering of the families affected, the family of the community, and the family of our Nation. I pray for the Pastor and Parish of Tumbler Ridge, and invite you to read Bishop Gary's letter of solidarity attached to this bulletin. Lord have mercy.

I'm writing from the Rectory of Holy Family Church in Ucluelet where the rain is plentiful and open shops and restaurants, less so. Seasonal work is the name of the game and many restaurant and storefronts have signs that read "Taking time for rest and renewal, see you at the end of February". Having said this, the Church under the administration of local Catholic wife and mother Katherine, has been hopping with activity. Shortly, I'll be celebrating a Mass for the children's catechism class, while the exterior of the Church is being cleaned by volunteers of the moss and algae that love this climate; Katherine's husband was out cutting back the ever-encroaching forest with a chain saw, and the 'hall' is being well used by an alternative school after last night's AA meeting. Unlike the big city, people here seem to have more time to linger and talk convincing me that 'life is bigger in a small town'. I'm grateful to Dcn. Philip, and Frs. Bernard and Claude offering the homily at Masses this



weekend in order that I can be relieved of the time for preparation to focus on serving the people who will only see one priest this entire month of February.



Pictured, I'm enroute via water taxi, to the largest First Nation of the West Coast of Vancouver Island on Flores Island where I met an old friend who gave Katherine and I a tour of the Ahousaht Village and some of its latest development. Mass was offered in a community hall used

for Christian worship for about 10 members, many of whom I've known for years. They were so grateful to celebrate 'Our Lady of Lourdes' and receive the sacrament of the Eucharist and Anointing. It's been a fantastic mission in Christian faith, hope and love so far.

It's not too early to announce our Lenten Parish mission with Bishop Joseph of the Kamloops Diocese from the weekend of March 7/8 through the 11th (see the poster with these bulletin pages). Plan now for a holy Lent starting this week on Ash Wednesday with a resolve to discipline your faith with extra prayer, alms and fasting. The Mission will be a great way to advance in Christ and make the Devil a little anxious. Our Fridays in Lent will necessarily be curtailed this year as we refresh the interior of the Church. At the moment I'm thinking we'll simply add "Stations" after the Friday Masses in order to allow for work to progress. It's part of our communal cross we must bear this Lent in order to prepare for a beautiful Easter.

No charge. All are warmly welcome to attend.




Ash Wednesday

We will celebrate 2 Masses on Ash Wednesday: at 12:00 pm and at 7:00 pm.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence throughout the universal church. Fridays of Lent are also compulsory days of abstinence throughout the universal church. In Canada, Catholics may substitute an act of charity in place of abstinence (but not fasting). However, it is strongly encouraged that some form of penitential discipline be undertaken.

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 - 59 years of age. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength is permitted, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. **Abstinence** is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fasting and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent.




Homebound Ministry

"Break Free"

Break free from the addictive cycles of lust, pornography and sexual addiction. This Spring, St Andrews Cathedral is offering a men's ministry called **Break Free** that is designed to help men find freedom from sins of lust and discover the beauty of God's plan for sexual intimacy.

From previous participants:

"Break Free has taught me that no matter how low you go in your addiction, there is always hope. I've learned that no matter how much I stumble, I can trust in the Lord to lift me back up."

"Break free has been really helpful in my journey towards purity and chastity. It gives you a perspective that helps you find the root of your struggle, and how to let God heal that part of yourself. Equally important, it provides a community of people with similar struggles and aspirations, who can journey with you. I would highly recommend it to anyone seeking to grow in chastity."

According to the Barna Group/Pure Desire Ministries, 74% of men in the church view pornography on a regular basis. Break Free is a group that every man should attend to be equipped with the tools needed to finish strong. Chains are broken and lives can be restored. Discover how to renew your mind and break destructive patterns.

Break Free will meet at St. Andrew's Cathedral (Mother Theresa Lounge) in a small-group format to provide a safe, anonymous space for men to be accountable to each other. This is a place where single or married men over the age of 19 can come together for support and acceptance.

Discovering the Beauty & Mystery of Femininity – Discovering the Strength & Mission of Masculinity.

Do you want a wife and kids or do you want to be a Husband and a Father?

Do you want a husband and kids or do you want to be a Wife and a Mother?

“Much remains to be done to prevent discrimination against those who have chosen to be wives and mothers...This is a matter of justice but also of necessity...It will force systems to be redesigned in a way which favours the processes of humanization which mark the “civilization of love.” Pope St. John Paul II.

A heartfelt reality that I am hearing often in the last couple of years, and more so recently, are beautiful young women who tell me that they do not experience being safe and/or accepted, sharing that at the core of the desire for their lives is to be a wife and mother. When asked who are they most often scorned by or ‘given that look of disbelief’ and they respond ‘other women’. They doubt themselves with thoughts like: Is the idea that choosing to be a wife and mother might be a betrayal of “feminine culture” and the simple answer is that **you are not betraying anything**. The desire to build a family and nurture a home is a valid and deeply personal aspiration that has been a central part of human experience for millennia. It is a path that countless strong, intelligent, and empowered women have chosen and cherished. The concept that the family is the essence of the first and vital cell of society: is a core tenet of **Catholic Social Teaching** and many other sociological perspectives, emphasizing that the family is the foundational unit from which all other social structures grow. The feminine and the masculine are designed by God to be complimentary in every aspect of the feminine nature and masculine nature. **Stay tuned for Theology of His Body and Theology of Her Body coming soon to St. Andrews Cathedral. What is Intercessory Prayer?

Intercessory prayer is a vital practice in the Christian faith. It involves praying on behalf of others. This gift allows believers to support one another spiritually. Through intercession, prayers become a powerful tool for change.

Intercessory prayer means praying specifically for others. Unlike personal prayer, where one asks God for their own needs or guidance, intercession focuses entirely on the needs of the person asking for prayer. It is an act of love and compassion, showing concern for the well-being of others. Intercessors stand in the gap between God and those they pray for, acting as spiritual advocates. This kind of prayer is often persistent and filled with faith, trusting that God hears and responds.

10 Tips for Making the Lenten Season More Meaningful

1. **Slow Down** – Set aside 10 minutes a day for silent prayer or meditation. It will revitalize your body and your spirit.
2. **Read a good book** – You could choose the life of a saint, a spiritual how-to, an inspirational book or one of the pope’s new books.
3. **Be kind** – Go out of your way to do something nice for someone else every day.
4. **Get involved** – Attend a Lenten lecture or spiritual program.
5. **Volunteer at your parish** – Whether it’s a parish reception, cleaning the church or helping with the soup kitchen, it will give you a chance to help others.
6. **Reach out** – Invite an inactive Catholic to come with you to receive ashes on Ash Wednesday, or come to Stations of the Cross, Confession or Mass with you anytime during Lent.
7. **Pray** – Especially for people you don’t like and for people who don’t like you.
8. **Tune out** – Turn off the television and spend quality time talking with family members or friends.
9. **Clean out closets** – Donate gently used items to the St. Vincent de Paul Society.
10. **Donate** – Pick a Catholic mission and decide how you can help by sending money, clothing or supplies.


