Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Rector's Desk

4th Sunday of Lent (Laetare) – March 15
2nd Scrutiny of the Catechumens

An odd pastoral foible occurred this week indicating a combination of human and technological failure. While driving, I used my car phone Bluetooth system to make a call to a parishioner battling some real health challenges. 'Handsfree', I asked the system to call "George" (not his real name). When George answered I identified myself and said I was praying for him at Mass and hoped for healing for him. George expressed thanks and said he was getting better day by day since getting out of the hospital. I thought something was a bit odd as I didn't think George at this point would be getting better day by day and wasn't aware he'd been in hospital. Our conversation continued pleasantly and then I realized that it wasn't George's voice. Without letting on, in humoured embarrassment, I realized my Bluetooth system called another "George" in my contact list. Needless to say, I'm now praying for two Georges instead of one! I've since made contact with my intended 'George'.

In a brief moment of prayerful inspiration while planning for Bishop Joseph's Lenten Mission, anticipating four clergy in rectory residence, I envisioned the possibility of the culinary gift of four nights of dinners. Bp. Joseph, Fr. Sean, Fr. Bernard and Fr. Claude all ordinarily live alone, and cook for themselves. With the clergy shortage around most of the Catholic world, it's a rare occasion to have a brotherly sense of priestly family and even rarer to sit and dine together like family. As a gastral beneficiary, I've joined my brothers at the dinner each night, and we all convey our sincere "thank you" to our volunteer cooks for providing not only sumptuous homecooked meals, but also fostering some terrific priestly fellowship and joy. God bless Rose, Maria, Sandi, Ernie and Rosanna. I'm writing in the midst of Bishop Joseph's mission presence among us and certainly sense the Lord's blessings as he teaches and models our 'cross centred' and 'hope filled' faith. Thank you, Bishop Joseph, Bishop Gary and the 9 other priests who served at our Penitential Service offering the mercy of Christ in Reconciliation.

This coming weekend, our rose vestment Laetare Sunday, we'll 'scrutinize' the catechumens for Easter Vigil sacraments of initiation at the 9:00 am Mass, and following the 11:00 am Mass offer our monthly occasion for intercessory prayers. The evening prior, after the Saturday 5:00 pm Mass, I invite the young adults to our continuing study of the Book of Acts in our parish centre upper lounge. Because of Bishop Joseph's presence last week, we didn't

mention the Lenten 'stewardship' awareness information piece in the bulletin. Both something of our budget and our giving patterns are important factors to be aware of. We thank God for substantially increased Mass attendance. In order to pastorally care for our large congregation, we've expanded our staffing, even though anticipating some deficit. We hope giving to the Lord's work and House might engage more people who will be intentional, sacrificial and joyful. Thanks to all for your continued support which makes this parish a beautiful and vibrant place of Jesus' ministry. Rejoice in the Lord.

Recognizing that God has given to us everything in trust, we are asked as followers of Christ to share in turn our gifts of time, talent and treasure for the benefit of others.

Chrism Mass

Update on Cathedral Painting Project



The Cathedral interior painting project appears to be progressing well and on schedule. Work on Zone 3 is well underway and should be completed by the end of next week, with work within the rounded portion of the Sanctuary to be completed by the end of this week.

Work on that portion of the Sanctuary extending into the transept is expected to be completed by the end of next week. During this time, the Altar will be temporarily located forward during weekday masses. As well, the Atrium Lift will remain in the Sanctuary during this time.

The Tabernacle, Tabernacle Lamp and Crucifix should be relocated at the end of next week.

The Stations of the Cross have all been cleaned, repaired and re-hung along the north side of the Cathedral.

There are no issues with plaster in the Sanctuary ceiling, and AA Painting does not expect that the plasterer will need to do any work in Zones 3 and 4, as the repairs needed are small enough that AA Painting will undertake them.

AA Painting is expecting to begin work on the wainscoting on March 23rd. As part of this work, the Carpenter will install/repair the quarter round trim atop the wainscoting. Work on the Narthex is to begin March 24th.

Prep work in balconies is apparently complete. AA Painting will complete work in these areas as bits of time become available and/or when they are asked to undertake quiet work during possible unexpected services.

AA Painting still expects to have completed all but the eastern portions of the ceiling (and above eastern portion of wall above triforium) by the end of March. All scaffolding, tarps, etc. will be out of the Cathedral and the Atrium Lift will be removed from inside the Cathedral for Easter.

AA Painting noted smooth working relationship with Cathedral Staff (which has undoubtedly contributed greatly to the apparent success of the project). 😊

We are not the Author of our Lives

One could comfortably say that the indifference towards the unborn human being in Canada is glaring. It is a daily part of Canadian life to destroy the life of an unborn human being. The death of our unborn human beings is rarely mentioned let alone discussed. And yet one hundred thousand unborn human beings are killed each year in Canada.

As was revealed at the recent "*Dying to Meet You*" presentation on Euthanasia awareness, more and more Canadians are warming up to and choosing MAiD (*Medical Assistance in Dying*) as the solution to many health issues. The more death is offered as the solution, the closer we get to Death on Demand. If death is a therapeutic solution, what's the incentive to do anything to prevent suicide or provide good palliative care? It begs the question -- is Canada killing itself from the moment of conception to death?

Here are terms frequently used to describe MAiD:

Euthanasia: When a physician intentionally ends a patient's life by administering a lethal injection.

Assisted Suicide: The prescribing of lethal drugs to a patient for the purpose of ending their own life.

Medical Assistance in Dying: An umbrella term for both euthanasia and assisted suicide.

By contrast we read in Scripture:

"You shall not murder" (Exodus 20:13; Matthew 19:18)

"Whatever you did for the least of these, you did for me"
(Matthew 25:40)

Let us stand with those whose very lives are created in God's image and likeness who are in jeopardy of succumbing to the culture of death.


