Baptism: If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Rector's Desk

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

September 27, 2026

I'm writing the first day of Autumn and thinking of the poetic and solemn passage of Ecclesiastes about the seasons of life, often read at funerals. "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die". (The Byrds musical rendition of the same passage from the 60's called *Turn, Turn Turn* is a favourite classic of folk rock).

In our effort to be a genuine Catholic Cathedral 'family', we're bringing to the forefront of ministry the necessity of caring for each other at the end of the season of this life. I'll be away next week in Halifax for a meeting of the Canadian Federation of Presbyteral (Priest's) Councils and arrive back just in time for our Saturday October 3rd, parish seminar on the "Catholic Way of Dying with Dignity". This requires education to combat the pernicious culturally justifiable killing called MAID, but it also means we need to step up and ensure a loving Christian presence to accompany our dying brothers and sisters.

Just last week, between Sunday Masses I heard in passing from a relative of one of our stellar volunteers, that he was in 'hospice'. I thought I had heard wrong and what was meant was 'hospital'. Having clarified the confusion and realizing the gravity of a member of our 'family' likely alone in hospice care, I immediately called Fr. Sean our Chaplain who subsequently was visiting within an hour at the bedside and offered ministry of Christ's presence and sacraments. Others soon were visiting, and I'll plan to pay a visit today. This is exemplary: the Church being informed and accompanying with love the process of being 'born to eternal life' through a natural holy death. You'll hear more about it soon, but keep November 14th free for a significant workshop with Halifax Deacon Larry Worthen called "Dying with Hope".

One of things I never learned in my three seminaries was managing staff. Until the Cathedral, this wasn't much of a question as I either had no staff, in positions like the Chaplaincy at UVic/Camosun, or in small parishes, had very little staffing. But here, we have upwards of 10 'staff' and I need to think about regular direction and encouragement. Thankfully our weekly meetings provide an excellent venue for communication, relationship and faith building, as well as more effectively planning for the ministry of Word and Sacrament. Last year, I implemented 'performance evaluations' taken admittedly from the terminology of corporate HR, but this year I've asked for a 'ministry review'. Each member of staff has been asked for a synopsis of a two-week period of their time expenditure and we'll have a look together to see if things are going well and thinking about helpful changes. Join me in

praying with thanksgiving for these servants who help guide our community of Catholic joy.

In addition to the ordinary pace of ministry, this week will have included a long-awaited wedding, a funeral, a house blessing and an anticipated number of baptisms at the 11:00 Mass Sunday. Saturday is opportunity for adoration before the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament after evening Mass and followed by a young adult fellowship. (The morning Mass also offers a time of exposition with Deacon Yuson and Fr. Claude). And men, keep in mind the resumption of my Scripture Study Wednesdays at 7:00 a.m. in the Parish Library.

God bless us all this fall season, and always.

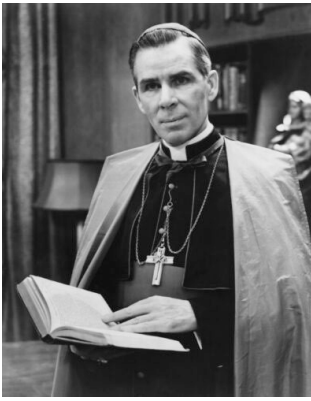

Blessed Fulton Sheen



Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen was beatified in St. Louis, Missouri, on September 24, 2026. The Mass was presided over by Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle on behalf of Pope Leo XIV. Known as one of the most influential Catholic evangelists of the 20th century, Archbishop Sheen reached tens of millions

through his groundbreaking television series *Life Is Worth Living*, bringing the Gospel into living rooms with warmth, wit, and clarity.

Declared Venerable in 2012, his path to beatification was cleared after a miracle attributed to his intercession: the recovery of a newborn boy in Illinois who showed no signs of life for 61 minutes.

Archbishop Sheen died in 1979 at age 84, and his feast day has been set for December 9. As "Blessed Fulton Sheen," may his example inspire us to share our faith boldly and joyfully, just as he did.

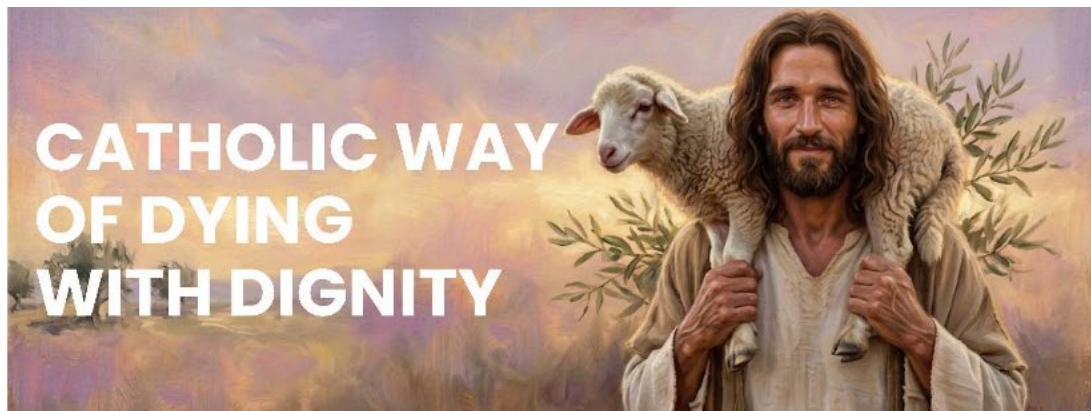
