Baptism: If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

Rosary Walk



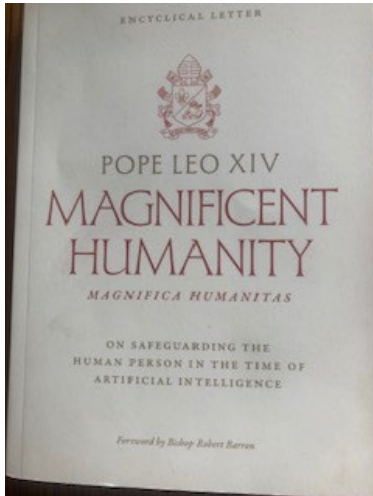

From the Rector's Desk

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

I've just finished reading the thought-provoking encyclical "Magnificent Humanity" by our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV. Amongst many themes that revolve around the central



thesis of protecting the dignity of persons in the age of artificial intelligence, he reminds the Church and the world of the importance of work and workers. "Work is not simply an instrument; it expresses and enhances the dignity of our lives. It is a requirement of the human condition, a normal path toward maturity, development

and personal fulfilment.... Financial assistance to the poor may at times be necessary in emergencies.... But the goal is to enable each person to live with dignity through his or her own work." (MH 149) With that, God bless all working people this Labour Day weekend.

The weather forecast this coming week is seasonally on cue with a general cooling and an increase in precipitation. Conversely, our Cathedral ministry is 'heating up'. I won't repeat the varied 'programs' mentioned in the bulletin that renew after a summer hiatus, but I am grateful for so many people ensuring we have a good range of initiatives to build up the Kingdom of God and equip the saints for mission.

About 30 people have expressed interest in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults starting September 10th with an important opportunity for our sponsorship leadership and candidates to get to know each other in friendship with Christ. Three years ago, we had 5 adults initiated sacramentally at the Easter Vigil, followed the next year by 15 and then last year a whopping 38. It appears we're close to matching last year's attendance. Meanwhile, our Mass attendance numbers have levelled off from 3 years ago while our stewardship giving increased about 15%. A small subcommittee of the Parish Council is meeting with me to plan implementation of good stewardship principles and ensure the Cathedral is being faithful with our varied resources. I'm thankful. All for the Glory of God as we seek to be faithful and fruitful in worship, pastoral care, mission and evangelization.

One significant area of pastoral emphasis this fall is ministry amongst those coming toward the end of this

earthly life. We'll have two workshops devoted to the subject of ensuring that our people know both faith and facts about dying with the comfort of God's peace. The Parish/Respect Life Ministry initiative is meant to complement and enhance the good ministry of communion and sacraments being offered to the homebound under the direction of Dcn. Philip Yuson. Not only are we to be convinced of the sin of MAID, but be assured we'll have companionship in Christ on the journey to the next life of paradise.

I believe the Lord is nudging me to incorporate more young people into relational conversation about the subject of vocations. As always, the need for priests is only increasing. This month, the long serving retired naval chaplain Fr. Marc Parent is covering for holidaying Fr. William at Our Lady of the Rosary. At 83 he's required to celebrate 4 weekend Masses and I've decided to help out and take two of those Sunday afternoon Masses to lighten his load just a bit. Fr. Claude continues to part from the parish Saturday after confessions to care for the Parish of All Saints that includes Lake Cowichan, Ladysmith and Chemainus. Fr. Sean covers the hospital and ministry to the sick for the city six days a week and six of us clergy on rotation take his calls Thursday to ensure he has a day of renewal and rest. All told, we priests seem to be serving well and maintaining some sense of work/life balance, but a few more clergy would help. I'll be attending the Canadian Federation of Presbyteral Council meetings in Halifax at the end of the month and theme is tellingly "Priestly Wellness in a Shifting Culture". Pray for us as we pray for you.

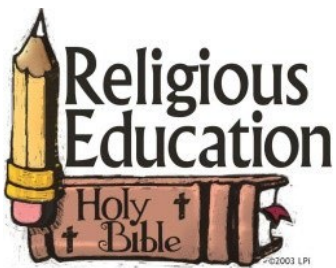
Your prayers continue to help us. Thank you.

Sacramental Preparation 2026-27 Registration Open!



Registration is now open for the 2026-27 year of Sacramental Preparation! Children at least 7 years old and teens will receive weekly catechesis to help nurture them in the faith and grow as a community

while preparing to receive the grace of the sacraments of Reconciliation (Confession), Eucharist (1st Communion), and Confirmation.

Our sacramental preparation program is designed as a two-year program running from fall into the spring. Children in Year 1 will prepare for the sacrament of Reconciliation, then in Year 2 they will prepare for the reception of their First Communion as well as Confirmation. Teens will prepare for any sacraments they may have missed in a separate one-year program.

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Beginning Apologetics

A Catholic Perspective of Steadfast Hope expressed with Gentleness and Respect

Sept 23 to Nov 25 – 10 weeks

St. Peter instructs believers to honor Christ as Lord and always be ready to explain their faith, stating: "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect". 1 Peter 3:15

Have you ever felt you had an opportunity to say something about your faith or the God you serve or His Catholic and Apostolic Church here on earth, but you could not find the words and then the moment passed? Perhaps this course may be the beginning for your leap of faith to "be prepared to give answer" and calling on the Holy Spirit, to find your voice.

Course consists of 10 sessions. Classes will generally be 1.5 hr long, held on Wednesdays, beginning September 23rd and finishing November 25th.

Two options for attendance are offered - 2PM in-person at Parish Centre or 6:30PM on zoom video meeting. Facilitator is Bernadette O'Connor. Registration required at Parish Office. Cost is \$25 for course handouts.
