As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Rector's Desk

16th & 17th Sundays in Ordinary Time

I returned last night after a 26-hour journey that included: three flights, hours of layovers in airports from Malaga to Lisbon, and from there to Toronto, and from there to Victoria. It was an extraordinary and grace filled 3-week holiday to Iceland, Scotland and Spain and worth every awkward contortion getting in and out of economy seats on the aircrafts (truly a first world discomfort). It was a privileged and unusual holiday expressing some of our sense of God's grace in celebration of a significant anniversary.



Pictured in a silly supposed Viking helmet (no I wasn't wearing it for a FIFA Norway game) in Iceland, I was tracing some of my ancestry and solemnly visited the then frozen fjord and volcanic ash-poisoned farmland that my great grandfather's family emigrated from

in the late 1880's to another harsh reality on the Saskatchewan prairie.

In ancestral Scotland, (also pictured inside and out) at Edinburgh Castle I was inspired by the oldest surviving building in that ancient City, St. Margaret's Chapel. St. Margaret died after a life of heroic virtue in that Castle in 1093 and I asked her to pray for us all at the Cathedral.



In both Iceland and Scotland, it's hard to find contemporary remnants of the pre-Protestant disruption/suppression of Catholic faith. Thankfully such was not the case in Malaga Spain where signs of a consistent historical Catholic presence were everywhere.

Interestingly in Edinburgh, extraordinary people were visiting that happened to drive by (I believe) in a small convoy of window tinted Land Rovers from Holyrood House. Perhaps they're ordinary folk in some ways having endured some family fragmentation, divorce, and father-son estrangement. But King Charles and Queen Camila aren't exactly ordinary people! In fact, the whole trip was a reminder of C.S. Lewis' significant Christian insight about myself and everyone else. "There are no ordinary people. You have never talked to a mere mortal. Nations, cultures, arts, civilizations - these are mortal, and their life is to ours as the life of a gnat. But it is immortals whom we joke with, work with, marry, snub and exploit - immortal horrors or everlasting splendors." (C.S. Lewis, *The Weight of Glory*).

I thank the Lord for the gift of a great holiday, but like Dorothy's insight in the Wizard of Oz, 'there's no place like home'. It's good to be back to serve Christ along with the rest of you extraordinary people of St. Andrew's. By the way, I'm so grateful for Fr. Bernard's presence among us and am sad to see him part for the Emerald Isle, but I have a strong suspicion we'll see him again.

Turning my attention to resumed Cathedral duties, I look forward to driving school bus Friday (the 17th) for a gathering of our altar servers that have organized a summer picnic. The 'Chalice' ministry of caring for underprivileged children in developing countries will visit after weekend Masses. An assortment of baptisms, weddings and marriage validations are on the calendar and I'm glad for upcoming team consultations with Parish Council and Cathedral staff.

Finally, after a great deal of prayer and consultation, I am happily able to offer a pilgrimage to Italy in April/May 2027. This follows a wonderfully inspired pilgrimage in 2025 to Marian shrines and places of apparition in Portugal, France and Spain, and another with the same Catholic travel agency to the Holy Land in 2023. These are holy occasions that offer terrific faith building relationships that might be right up your alley. I know

this is expensive with war driven cost increases, but I believe still merits consideration. I hope to have the itinerary and details regularly in the bulletin. After some time for Cathedral parishioners to register, I'll open it up to others within the Diocese. The limit is basically a bus full of 45. Blessings and hope to see you at Masses this weekend.

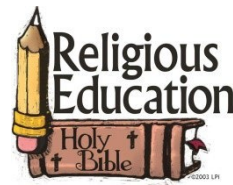

From the Desk of Respect Life Ministry

A recent *Church for Vancouver* article warns that boys and young men are increasingly targeted online by predators who coerce their victims into sharing explicit photographs, which are used to extort victims for financial gain.

These crimes have been linked to real cases of self-harm and even suicide among Canadian youth. Boys under 18 make up the vast majority of reported cases, making open communication with children about online safety essential.
