Baptism: If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Desk of Respect Life Ministry

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

June 28 2026

Our *No One Dies Alone* workshop in May was filled to capacity. We are grateful to everyone who participated and contributed to the thoughtful discussions.

The workshop provided an in-depth look at MAiD and its growing presence in end-of-life care. Many participants expressed surprise at how rapidly MAiD is becoming part of the conversation surrounding death and dying in Canada. The feedback we received has been invaluable as we plan future workshops.

As we continue this important ministry, we hope to address both the realities of MAiD and, even more importantly, the Catholic understanding of the dignity of every human life and the call to accompany those who are suffering. Future workshops will include personal testimonies from individuals who have journeyed alongside loved ones at the end of life, offering witness to the compassion, hope, and presence that are at the heart of Christian accompaniment.

We welcome your prayers and support as we seek to foster a culture of care, compassion, and respect for life at every stage.

Many people find themselves unsure about how we accompany an individual who is choosing medical assisted suicide (MAiD). First and foremost, we must pray for God's Divine Intervention in that person's life. The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops provide us with clear directives which assist us in our understanding 'pastoral accompaniment'.

The [Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops \(CCCB\)](#) states that **priests, chaplains, and lay Catholics must not remain in the room or be present** while a person undergoes Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD)^{1,2}.

The bishops heavily emphasize the theological distinction between "pastoral accompaniment"—which means walking with a suffering person through their end-of-life journey—and physically staying with them during the specific act of assisted suicide³.

The core directives from the Canadian bishops regarding presence during MAiD focus on several distinct areas that are meant to assist us in our accompaniment.

Forbidden Presence During the Act

- **Avoiding Scandal:** A priest or caregiver remaining in the room while the lethal dose is administered is explicitly forbidden.
- **No Implied Approval:** The Church dictates that staying can be interpreted as approval or validation of the act.
- **Complicity:** Physical presence during the termination of life is viewed as a form of moral complicity.
- **Departing Before Administration:** Pastoral ministers are instructed to leave the room before the medical team begins the MAiD procedure.

Rules on Pastoral Care and Sacraments

- **Sacramental Restrictions:** Priests are instructed that they cannot administer the Anointing of the Sick or Viaticum (Last Communion) if a patient is actively determined to proceed with MAiD, as the sacraments require a disposition to let life end naturally⁴.
- **Prayer Permitted:** Clergy can pray with the individual and their family prior to the procedure, up until the point the medical process begins. [1]
- **No Post-Death Abandonment:** The Church notes that families should still be ministered to with compassion, and bishops generally leave the decision to grant Catholic funerals up to local pastoral discretion⁵.

Stance on Facilities and Catholic Health Care

- **Total Non-Permissibility:** The bishops have unanimously declared that MAiD cannot be performed within any health facility with a Catholic identity⁶.
- **Forced Patient Transfers:** If a patient in a Catholic hospital insists on MAiD, they must be safely transferred out of the building to a secular facility⁷.
- **Palliative Care Promotion:** The CCCB urges Catholics to respond to end-of-life suffering through active involvement in palliative care⁸ rather than assisted dying⁹.

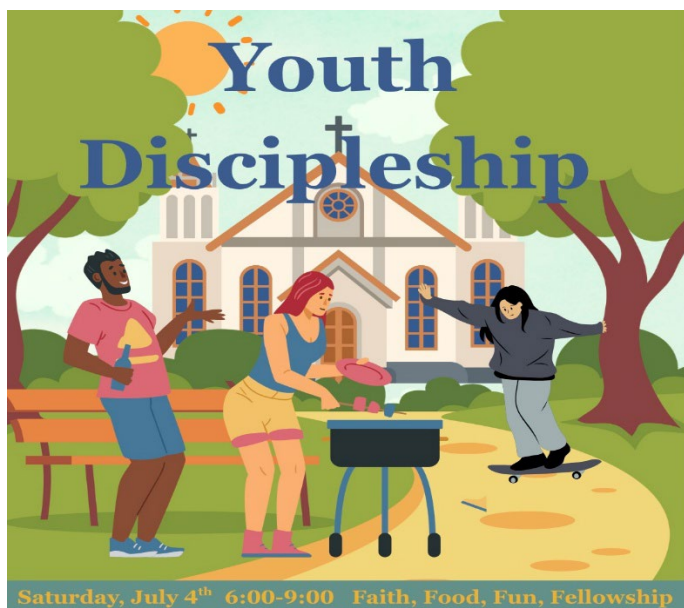

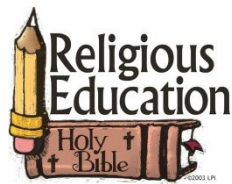

The Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development has released 5 infographics outlining the key elements in each chapter, which we have shared over the past 5 weeks.

We hope you have enjoyed reading these infographics and that they have helped deepen your understanding of Pope Leo XIV’s first Encyclical Letter, *Magnifica Humanitas*.

Let us become “builders of communion, rather than architects of Babel!” (MH 116) so that humanity may not lose its magnificence and the world may recognize, in the human heart, the place where God desires to dwell.
