**Baptism:** If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

**Marriage:** Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

**Funeral:** Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

## From the Rector's Desk

### IT'S SUMMER

I'm writing the day after my June 15<sup>th</sup> second anniversary as your Rector at St. Andrew's. It seems like a long eventful commencement, and yet at the same time the years have flown by. The Parish leadership set some goals in October of 2024, based upon our prayerful reading of the parish "Rebuilt" by Fr. Michael White and Tom Corcoran. Many goals have been accomplished by the receptivity of God's leadership, and strategic hard work to keep in step with the Spirit. Sacraments have been faithfully celebrated, the Word enthusiastically proclaimed, the poor have been served, a sense of community has increased along with our attendance. At a slower pace, we've seen a substantial uptick in our financial stewardship. The number of small groups for fellowship and service has multiplied, the souls of those converting into full Catholic communion has dramatically increased, partly as a result of practicing better evangelistic hospitality to those crossing our thresholds at weekend Masses. Volunteer leadership has stabilized and been fruitful and our staffing has necessarily expanded with our new Music Director, Priest Assistant, Lay Pastoral Assistant and High School Youth Discipleship Coordinator. I think we should all pause for a moment and simply praise and thank the Lord for his powerful, peaceful presence among us. Having said all that, our goal of every member engagement in the practice of the faith through fellowship and service is still beyond the horizon. And I think we're in the starting block regarding intentional missionary proclamation and service to those who have yet to come into our Cathedral building. Needless to say, there's room for holy improvement. I wonder if another parish leadership conference should be planned for the fall?

Two relatives of a Bishop and priest who served the Diocese over a century ago have made a visit to the Diocese this week from their home in Holland. Bishop Lemmens is credited with funding much of St. Andrew's building through his sacramental service in South America where he died and is laid to rest. I'll have a brief bio of our spiritual founder elsewhere in the bulletin.

After this weekend's Masses and Summer Celebration, I'll be off for a bucket list holiday with Linda to celebrate our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary (July 5<sup>th</sup>) and respective 65<sup>th</sup> birthdays. God has been good and we wish to thank Him in two ancestral homelands of Iceland and Scotland, followed by a hot week in Malaga Spain. I'm grateful for Fr. Bernard who will take my weekend Masses as he begins to wind up his sabbatical from Ireland. Fr. Sean helps out as always

and we're blessed to have him in the rectory. You'll also see Fr. Claude on July 2<sup>nd</sup> after his 21-day mandatory Ladysmith isolation following his holiday in the Congo. Finally, I look forward to blessing all you Dads in the Masses this weekend. I know from personal experience we need all the blessing we can get, in order to be a blessing to our wives, our children and grandchildren, parents, siblings, and everyone else in our lives. Thank the Lord for our Fathers and together let's ask St. Joseph to pray for us.

## Biography

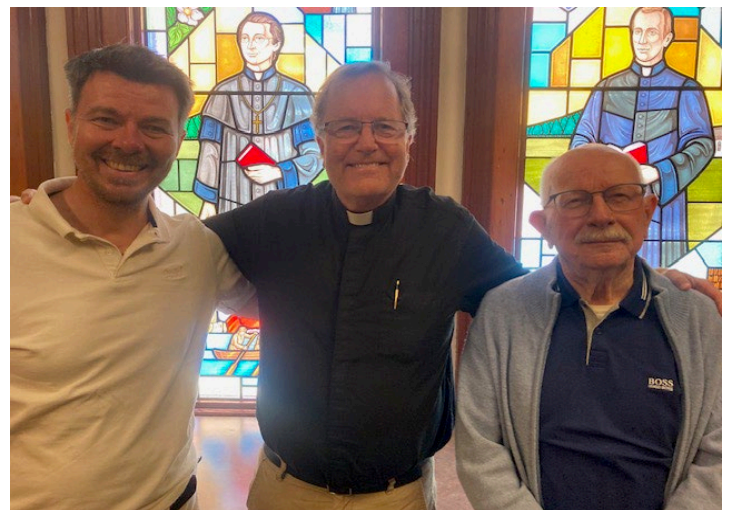
### Bishop John Nicolas Lemmens



Born in Holland in 1850 and ordained in Belgium, Father Lemmens arrived in the Diocese of Vancouver Island (now known as the Diocese of Victoria) in 1876, quickly becoming known for his missionary work with Indigenous communities

across Vancouver Island. In 1883, he was appointed to St. Andrew's Cathedral, and on August 5<sup>th</sup> 1888, he was consecrated Bishop.

From 1889 to 1895, Bishop Lemmens oversaw the construction of the present St. Andrew's Cathedral, a landmark project that defined the diocese. To fund this magnificent cathedral, he traveled to Guatemala to raise funds and minister. This work ultimately cost him his life when, after nearly a year of ministry in Guatemala, he contracted intestinal fever and died on August 10<sup>th</sup> 1897. Bishop Lemmens is still buried in Coban Cathedral, as attempts to return his body to Victoria have been unsuccessful. However, his legacy endures in this spiritual home for Victoria's faithful.

### NOTICE OF REFUGEE COMMITTEE TERMINATION

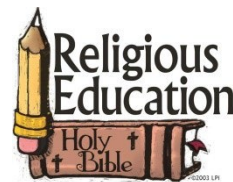
After over 10 years of dedicated and effective ministry the refugee committee of St. Andrew's Cathedral has finished its work.

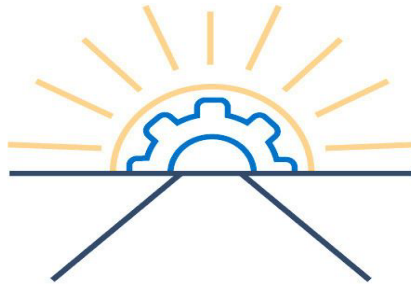
