

Baptism of the Lord**

January 11, 2026

Back in July of 2024 I received the gift of a stay at "Fossil Bay Resort" from owners Gerhard and Maria Wild as I prepared to depart their parish of Our Lady of the Rosary after five years of serving as Pastor. They operate six cottages situated on an ocean bluff between French Beach and Jordan River. It's the perfect place to rest and recharge after the holy and hectic Advent and Christmas season in which Linda and I have hosted many family house guests and participated in multiple social gatherings of both familial and parochial variety. The Cathedral itself, the mother Church of the Diocese has been the sacramental home to thousands during this Christ inspired season and it's tuckered me out a bit. I've already enjoyed one long leisurely beach walk and two serious day time naps after a decent sleep last night. Thanks be to God! Here's hoping that all of you receive from the good Lord just what you need to keep you energized and fulfilled for service in Christ's mission. Your Cathedral staff have been working very hard this season on your behalf and I pray that a little extra time off over these past days of Christmas has helped them rest in the Lord and prepare to serve you in 2026. You might not be thinking about it, but I'm anticipating our Lenten season commencement on Ash Wednesday February 18th. In the midst of it I'm pleased to announce we'll have a mission with Bishop Joseph Nguyen of Kamloops as our Mission preacher from March 8-11th. He was my guest retreat master for a UVic/Camosun campus retreat held at Christ the King in Courtenay and was a fantastic communicator of the gospel.

As mentioned at some Masses, we're anxiously awaiting the Canadian government to process the work permit necessary for Iason Giagtzoglou to come into the country and take up his position as our Musical Worship Director. All has been submitted properly with the assistance of the Diocesan immigration lawyer, so it's simply a matter of waiting and praying. Would you please join us in prayer for this intention. In faith, I'd like you to set aside the evening of February 7th following the 5:00 p.m. Mass to enjoy a recital by Iason followed by a wine and cheese social in the Parish Centre to enjoy an occasion to meet with all our staff, both new and not so new. In the meantime, join me in thanking our musicians and choristers who are providing beautiful and inspired music for our liturgies. Once Iason is in place we'll need to call back those who have taken a choir sabbatical and

invite all other 'closet' potential choir members in the congregation to build up our wonderful music ministry

You may be encouraged to know that our annual collection of \$11,000 was distributed to families, singles and seniors within our family of faith. Hillside gift cards were gratefully received by approximately 50 who expressed need this financially difficult season. While we continue to look after folk like those of the soup kitchen and those of the St. Vincent de Paul community, as the Book of Hebrews exhorts, we can't neglect the needy amongst those within our worshipping community. I'm grateful for Matthew's assistance both pastorally and administratively in this good charitable work.

All regular ministry small groups are back up and running: RCIA, Lectio Devina Scripture meditation, men's Scripture study, Wednesday Bible study with Bernadette, catechism classes for children, Break free, and all the other little 'families' of faith that make up the family of St. Andrew's.

God bless us all with a holy New Year of 2026.

Intercessory Prayer January 18th after 11AM

Intercessory prayer is a vital practice in the Christian faith. It involves praying on behalf of others. This gift allows believers to support one another spiritually. Through intercession, prayers become a powerful tool for change. Intercessory prayer means praying specifically for others. Unlike personal prayer, where one asks God for their own needs or guidance, intercession focuses entirely on the needs of the person asking for prayer. It is an act of love and compassion, showing concern for the well-being of others. Intercessors stand in the gap between God and those they pray for, acting as spiritual advocates. This kind of prayer is often persistent and filled with faith, trusting that God hears and responds.

Who Am I to Judge?

Faith Study by Dr. Edward Sri.

Want something to boost you in living your faith afresh in the New Year? Join our next Faith Study course. This 8-part study program by Dr. Edward Sri gives us a vital key to how we can hold onto our morality and share our Catholic moral worldview even in a world that no longer believes in truth. Using engaging stories and personal experience, Edward Sri helps us understand the classical view of morality and equips us to engage relativism, appealing to both the head and the heart. Learn how Catholic morality is all about love, how making a judgment is not judging a person's soul, and how, in the words of Pope Francis, "relativism wounds people" and is "the spiritual poverty of our times."

Every year, from January 18 to January 25, Christians around the world come together to observe the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (WPCU), a beautiful and transformative occasion where believers from different traditions unite in prayer and reflection.

The theme for the 2026 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is a powerful one: “There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to the one hope of your calling” (*Ephesians 4:4*). The theme this year exemplifies the divine unity that is central to our mission and is sustained by the profound love of Jesus Christ, who has set before us a unified purpose. For this year, the prayers and reflections for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by the faithful of the Armenian Apostolic Church, along with their brothers and sisters of the Armenian Catholic and Evangelical Churches.

This theme invites us to dive deep into our shared faith, especially the hope and joy found in the resurrection, which is a central message of Christianity.

All over the world, Christians are invited to reflect on Christ’s resurrection, not just as an event that happened long ago, but as the foundation of a living hope that we are called to share with all people. The resurrection is the source of our hope and joy—and it’s something to be lived out together, with one voice.

Spiritual Reflection and Prayer on St. Anthony of the Desert

When St. Anthony of the Desert heard the words of Jesus, “*If you wish to be perfect, go, sell what you have, and give it to the poor*” (*Matthew 19:21*), he did not treat them as an idea to admire but as a call to obey. Taking the Gospel literally, Anthony let go of wealth, security, and social status, choosing the desert as the place where his heart could belong wholly to God. His life reminds us that Christian perfection is not about having more, but about loving more—loving God without reserve and trusting Him completely. The desert stripped Anthony of distractions and revealed both his weakness and God’s faithfulness. In that empty place, he discovered true freedom and joy. St. Anthony challenges us to ask what we are still holding onto and invites us to trust that when we surrender all, God gives us everything we truly need.



Prayer:

O God of the Gospel call,
through the example of St. Anthony of the Desert,
teach us to hear Your word with open and willing hearts.
Give us the courage to let go of whatever keeps us from

You,

and the grace to trust in Your providence.

May we learn, like St. Anthony,
to seek perfection not in possessions,
but in faith, humility, and love.

Lead us into the quiet places of our hearts,
where You alone are enough.
