Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Rector's Desk

5th Sunday of Easter / The Month of Mary

We anticipate a prayerful crowning ceremony at the children's homily this coming Sunday at the 9:00 a.m. Mass to inaugurate the joyful Marian Month of May. Hail Mary! Once again, a huge thanks to Jade our catechist who prepared some 30 children throughout the year for their first confessions with me and Fr. Sean last Sunday afternoon. Thanks be to God for our precious children and their families.

Those of us at the 11:00 a.m. Mass Sunday were blessed to hear Msgr. Greg Smith of the Archdiocese of Vancouver offer the homily with an emphasis on vocation to the priesthood and particularly his own vocation. It was both inspiring and encouraging to learn how St. Andrew's fostered his vocation over 40 years ago, a vocation he's been grateful for and lived happily for decades. While living in Victoria as a student and then working, a combination of the sacred liturgies, the choir, good friends, the beautiful building itself and the mentoring of the late Rector, Msgr. Philip Hanley, helped him to hear the Good Shepherd's voice call him to ministerial priesthood. (Thinking of choir, Iason is open to hearing from anyone with a desire to serve the parish by singing unto the Lord). Amongst the many notable statements, Msgr. Greg said we have to create a culture of vocation in which we regularly talk about the gift of vocation and encourage (not pressure) men and women to consider the call. In that regard, please speak with young men in your lives about holy priesthood and young women about consecrated life as a religious nun or sister. If anyone would like to discuss this, let's make an appointment and plot a plan of discernment. Speaking of priesthood, this week Fr. Bernard returns from a sabbatical program of renewal in Ontario, just as Fr. Claude prepares for a month-long holiday (departing on the 11th) in Belgium and his home country of Congo. God speed Fr. Claude and welcome back Fr. Bernard.

The monthly Parish Council meets this week and there are a few changes anticipated. After serving over 2 three-year terms, Jim O'Reilly, Richard Dunstan, and John Mellis will be 'retiring'. With Jonathan Eades our Chair, I thank these members whose wise and faithful counsel has been appreciated by 3 successive Rectors. God bless them in continued service to the Lord as we prayerfully seek new members to replace them. Specifically, we hope to find people that represent something of the youthful diversity of our dynamic Cathedral community. Jonathan or I would welcome suggestions.

High school youth are invited by Giordano and leaders to an evening of faith and fun this Saturday after the 5:00

p.m. Mass in the Parish Centre. Young Adults hosted a lovely evening holy hour of exposition and adoration last week. What a great joy to see the Cathedral full of eager youth that seek to love and follow Jesus. As mentioned at announcements we really need to step up the mission of evangelization by practicing hospitality and helping Matthew with his post-Mass ministry of welcome and the disciple making ministry of sponsoring those entering into the September Rite of Christian Initiation. Let's be open to our vocation of baptismal ministry and ask the Lord, like Samuel, to "speak Lord for your servant is listening".

Raising Awareness is Prevention: Abortion and Euthanasia – March for Life: May 14, 2026

From the Desk of Respect Life Ministry.

The normalization of these issues as "Healthcare" demonstrates how legislation can fundamentally affect public perception. This begs the question: **Am I numb and indifferent, or do I believe in the Sanctity of Life from the moment of conception to natural death?**

How Canada Arrived at Normalizing Euthanasia and Abortion, thereby Normalizing the Culture of Death

Normalization as Healthcare: Abortion became legal in Canada on January 28, 1988, when the Supreme Court of Canada struck down Section 251 of the Criminal Code as unconstitutional in the *R. v. Morgentaler* decision. The court ruled that restrictions on abortion violated a woman's right to life, liberty, and security of the person under Section 7 of the Constitution.

Widespread Lack of Awareness: Polls, such as one conducted in 2013, have shown that a significant number of Canadians (77%) were unaware that no specific law governing abortion exists in Canada. This contributes to a belief that the issue is settled.

Political Avoidance: No federal government since 1991 has attempted to pass a new abortion law. Mainstream political parties typically avoid re-opening the debate, which reinforces the perception that the status quo is untouchable.

"Wedge Issue" Fatigue: While abortion is discussed during elections, voters tend to be satisfied with the current, unrestricted access; a 2020 poll indicated that 75% of Canadians were satisfied with the current state of abortion policies.

Misinformation and Re-branding: Opposing viewpoints are often raised through specialized lobbying groups which can be dismissed by the broader public as fringe activity, thus maintaining the status quo. However, the overwhelming, long-term political inaction has resulted in a broad, yet potentially passive, public consensus.

Current Standing: Abortion is now treated as a legal, publicly funded healthcare service at any stage of pregnancy, governed by provincial and medical regulations. The United Nations reports that globally, approximately 73 million induced abortions take place worldwide each year. The UN is actively pushing for the decriminalization of abortion worldwide and calling for states to treat restrictions as human rights violations.

In conclusion let us pray with hope and commit to at least one or all three actions by participating in one of the March For Life awareness events on May 14th. Mass at 12 noon with Archbishop Smith speaking and presiding; 1:45 pm: March leaves from Centennial Square and processes down Government Street to BC Legislature. Rally commences at 2:15 and concludes 3:15. March For Life Gala: 5pm at St. Patrick's Parish, tickets \$65.00 per person.

Next week we'll discover how the normalization of MAID came to be accepted as part of End of Life Care.

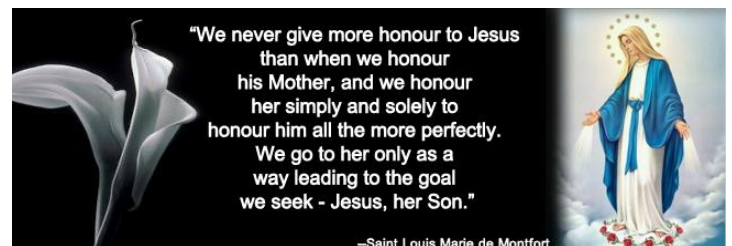
