## Triumphalism leads away from love & unity Lk 18:9-14

An English friend who went to a Protestant school in the times before Vatican II, told me that as a Catholic he was never allowed to attend school assemblies. At that time Catholics were taught that they alone had the one true faith and they kept themselves apart from everyone else. My friend knew the Mass in Latin, loved the Catholic traditions, but had no idea that he could talk to God in English, or about God to anyone not Catholic.

For him, the Second Vatican council opened the door to a much greater unity with God and His people. Suddenly, there he was, not having to sit on the sidelines, afraid to speak about Jesus. Some theologians have labelled the previous behavior as 'triumphalism'; it surely did not align with Paul's message today,

"Through me the message might be fully proclaimed, and all the Gentiles might hear it." [2Tim4:16-18]

This 'better-than' behavior is reprimanded by Jesus in the Gospel very clearly, in words that are so familiar but often not applied within the institutions to which we belong:

"Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, but whoever humbles himself, will be exalted."

Our faith is always growing in understanding. We know that when we confess in our Creed the 'One' church, this means *all* Gods people. Let us pray with Pope Leo XIV for love and unity. God loves each of us no more and no less that any other person he created. Lord Jesus, you came to show us that rules do not bring us closer to You. Please help us to understand and follow your path of love.

### From the Rector's Desk 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time October 26, 2025

Early last Wednesday morning, with fresh cup of coffee in hand, I opened the Times Colonist and was surprised to see an article and photo of two First Nation friends; a mother and son, Janet and Hudson who hail from Ahousaht near Tofino. The article describes an event at the site of one our two Catholic residential schools (Christie), to



allow elders who attended to vent their feelings prior to a building demoliton. The Ahousaht hereditary chiefs hosted the experience recognizing that for some, there is tremendous need for healing after enduring various traumas of childhood loss that the school represents. With the Papal pilgrimage of penance by Pope Francis, combined with my former parish's healing day with 200 First Nation people representatives of our Diocese a few years ago, and administrating our Diocesen Indigenous Reconciliation Fund, I have been entering into the sorrow, suffering, resilience and joy of the peoples who went to residential schools since 2012. What you never see in the news however, is the relational stories of truth, reconciliation and friendship building between us. In fact, Tuesday night before the published article, I attended the Nuu-chah-nulth culture night at St. Joseph's hall where Janet was dancing and her grandson was leading the drum circle. The grandson regularly refers to me as 'Uncle' because we're family. As Pope Francis said regarding the clergy and the news; we're like airplanes because we only get into the news when we crash! This coming Saturday is a big Ahousaht cultural event at St. Joseph's and organizers have asked if anyone would be willing to volunteer with food prep and clean up. If anyone wants to put reconcilation into action with a bit of volunteer work let me know and I'll put you in touch with the organizer.

It's probably important that you know I'll be supporting the Bishop's appeal and plan to increase my contribution this year. Not only does it support many needs in our Diocesan family, but contributes to the spiritual welfare of really needy brother and sisters in Yukon and overseas. We also hope use the 'parish portion' of \$107,000.00 to design and construct a permanent baptistry which is only fitting for a Cathedral.

Outside of our central and foundational Sunday liturgies of the Holy Mass, me and the staff keep very busy with

serving peoples spiritual and sacramental needs with weddings, baptisms and funerals. Our staffing is expanding and changing with the addition of Fr. Claude, Anjali in the office and Matthew serving as Pastoral Assistant. Annette continues to offer tremendous pastoral counselling to many, and Rita manages to keep the ship afloat from the office. Steve, our custodian continues to heal from a pulled achilles at home and, with additional support from Michael and others, we limp along trying to keep the parish centre and Cathedral clean. Please join me in praying for our staff and thanking God for them.

### Bishop's Appeal


