From the Rector's Desk

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It was good to see the robust turn out (including many Catholics) for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity service at the Anglican Christ Church Cathedral last Sunday. The multi-aged, beautifully vested and impeccably trained Anglican choir was a sentimental reminder of my days on sabbatical in Oxford when the only quasi-professional music I could afford was participating in College choral evensong services. Sublime! The Presbyterian minister's homily was engaging and the Ethiopian Orthodox community's linguistic and musical offering was as festive as it was novel. Let's hope it produces some ecumenical fruit.

Thinking of the Anglicans, I'm borrowing some of their good resources on the subject of 'Stewardship'. Along with 'Vocations', this is an area I believe the Lord desires us to foster at St. Andrew's. I've tasked members of the Parish Council and Finance Committee to assist me in developing an educational and engagement strategy to increase the percentage of our parishioner commitment to stewarding with gratitude their 'time', 'talent' and 'treasure'. By all accounts we're moving in the right direction with increased Mass attendance, modestly increased donations, and the expansion of volunteer-led faith development small groups. Yet we have a ways to go. Every member in ministry is the goal, and closing the gap on our ongoing operating expenses exceeding our weekly giving is another goal. In order to lead by example (and practice what I preach), our family's weekly giving is increasing by a third in gratitude for God's blessings.

From a 2018 document called "Parish Stewardship Best Practices Evaluation" from the Anglican Diocese of Toronto: *"To be true stewards we must gladly share with others our time, our talent and our treasure. The lesson of scripture is not to be viewed in isolation from our daily lives. Scripture provides a real and complete guideline to living our daily lives as followers of Jesus Christ, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength and you shall love your neighbour as yourself" (Mark 12:30-31). Christ's teachings and life are our model for stewardship "It was for this that God called you, for Christ himself suffered for you and left you an example, so that you would follow in his steps" (1Peter 2:21). Embracing a life of Christian stewardship is the way we offer thanks to God for what God is already doing for us....*

The good news as found in Holy Scripture guides and nourishes us on our faith journey. The way we live gives testimony to our belief that our God is a God of salvation and mercy. We are mindful of the need to feed the hungry, give drink to those who thirst, welcome the stranger, clothe the naked, care for the sick and visit those imprisoned (Matthew 26: 35-36). As stewards, we live to give hope to others. Loving our neighbour as ourselves acknowledges that we have a responsibility beyond our own interests. In his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus challenges his followers to become "other" centred. We are a Christian community endowed with many wonderful blessings. In gratitude, our faith obliges us to share what we have received with those less fortunate and those on the margins of society. As we strive for justice and peace among all peoples, we seek to create the world as Christ himself envisioned it: a world where people freely give without expecting in return and give in abundance because of the joy that is experienced in giving. In living the life of a joyful steward, we can then proclaim that *"there is more happiness in giving than in receiving"* (Acts 20:35). I'll be writing and preaching more on this subject through Lent and beyond and pray it will be inspiring and fruitful.

Of course, our primary identity which fosters both vocations and stewardship is rooted in our worship of the Blessed Trinity. Interestingly, not one but two wonderful opportunities are offered on Saturday (January 31st) with Masses and affiliated occasions for restful and contemplative 'adoration'. After the morning celebration, Men are invited to the Segher's Hall for fellowship and faith formation, while the evening Mass with adoration will offer Young Adults with an occasion for fellowship. All however, are invited to participate in Mass/Adoration. Finally, young families are encouraged to join the Collins at a pot luck in the Parish Centre from 4:30 on Sunday (February 1st). Peace,

We hope to reopen the Adoration Chapel sometime in late Spring, once the painting project is complete.


Knights of Columbus Prayer Service


Blessing of Throats

A special blessing of throats, traditionally given on the feast day of St. Blaise, will be offered at the 12:10 Mass on **Tuesday, February 3rd**. The blessing of St. Blaise for ailments of the throats and all other evils may be received by all, including those who are not Catholic.



World Day of the Sick Sacrament of Anointing

On Wednesday, February 11th (*Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and World Day of the Sick*), Fr. Bernard, Fr. Claude and Fr. Sean, will be offering the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick during the Weekday Mass. Mass will start at 12:00 pm that day, and the Anointing will take place after the Homily. Mass will be a little longer that day for those remaining after the anointing.



This Sacrament is a healing ritual for anyone suffering with an ailment of body, mind or spirit and will involve prayer, the laying on of hands, and anointing the forehead and hands with blessed oil to provide spiritual strength, peace, and sometimes physical healing.

“Break Free”

Break free from the addictive cycles of lust, pornography and sexual addiction. This Spring, St Andrews Cathedral is offering a men's ministry called **Break Free** that is designed to help men find freedom from sins of lust and discover the beauty of God's plan for sexual intimacy.

From previous participants:

“Break Free has taught me that no matter how low you go in your addiction, there is always hope. I've learned that no matter how much I stumble, I can trust in the Lord to lift me back up.”

“Break free has been really helpful in my journey towards purity and chastity. It gives you a perspective that helps you find the root of your struggle, and how to let God heal that part of yourself. Equally important, it provides a community of people with similar struggles and aspirations, who can journey with you. I would highly recommend it to anyone seeking to grow in chastity.”

According to the Barna Group/Pure Desire Ministries, 74% of men in the church view pornography on a regular basis. Break Free is a group that every man should attend to be equipped with the tools needed to finish strong. Chains are broken and lives can be restored. Discover how to renew your mind and break destructive patterns.

Break Free will meet at St. Andrew's Cathedral (Mother Theresa Lounge) in a small-group format to provide a safe, anonymous space for men to be accountable to each other. This is a place where single or married men over the age of 19 can come together for support and acceptance.

We will go through a 12-week curriculum that will cover:

- *Conquer Series: The Battle Plan for Purity* (trailer, <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=--zNEGkXBwU>),
- *Forged: 33 Days Toward Freedom* (Jason Everett, <https://chastity.com/products/forged/>)
- *Theology of the Body* (St John Paul II) that provides proven principals and practical tools to help you to reform your mind and walk with sexual integrity.

Discovery Faith Study




Due to the sensitive nature of the ministry, volunteers will need to undergo a criminal record check.

Catholic Schools' Week: Feb 1 - 7, 2026



Today marks the beginning of Catholic Schools' Week (CSW). The theme this year is *Living, Celebrating, and Proclaiming Our Faith*. Each and every year, Catholic schools join together to share a message about the importance and value of Catholic education to the Church and society as a whole. For those that are not aware, there are five Catholic Schools in the Diocese (4 elementary and 1 high school) educating approximately 1610 students in the communities of Port Alberni, Duncan and Victoria. On behalf of all the Catholic schools in the diocese, thank you for your ongoing support whether that be through prayer, time, talent or treasure. This week also marks the beginning of registration time for the 2026-2027 school year. We invite you and your family to consider registering your children in one of our Catholic schools. We remain grateful for your prayers as we live our faith through this dynamic ministry.

What is “Lectio Divina”?

Latin for “Divine reading”, Lectio Divina is a traditional method of praying with scripture that comes out of the monastic tradition, but which is easy to practice in everyday busy life. It consists of 4 steps:

1. **Read.** Select a short passage and read it slowly and intentionally. Imagine yourself in the scene. Pay attention to anything that stands out to you – a word, a phrase, an image, a question...
2. **Meditate.** Let the words sink in. Reflect on them while sitting in the presence of God.
3. **Pray.** Allow the meditation to lead you into conversation with God. How is God speaking to you through His Word today? How is he asking you to respond?
4. **Contemplate.** Rest in God's presence, letting go of thoughts and words, simply being with him, receiving his love as a gift.

What is Intercessory Prayer?

Intercessory prayer is a vital practice in the Christian faith. It involves praying on behalf of others. This gift allows believers to support one another spiritually. Through intercession, prayers become a powerful tool for change.

Intercessory prayer means praying specifically for others. Unlike personal prayer, where one asks God for their own needs or guidance, intercession focuses entirely on the needs of the person asking for prayer. It is an act of love and compassion, showing concern for the well-being of others. Intercessors stand in the gap between God and those they pray for, acting as spiritual advocates. This kind of prayer is often persistent and filled with faith, trusting that God hears and responds.

St. Blaise



St. Blaise (died c. 316 AD) was a 4th-century physician and Bishop of Sebastea in Armenia (modern Turkey) venerated as a Christian martyr and saint. Known as one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers, he is the patron saint of throat ailments, wild animals, and wool combers, famous for healing a child choking on a fishbone while imprisoned.

Before becoming a bishop, he was a doctor who later lived as a hermit in a cave on Mount Argeus, where he was known to heal animals. During the persecution of Christians under Roman Emperor Licinius, he was arrested, tortured and beheaded. While in prison, he saved a boy who was choking to death on a fishbone, leading to his patronage over throat illnesses. He is revered as a "physician of souls" and a healer. The blessing of throats prayer asks God to deliver the faithful from throat ailments and other illnesses.

St. Blaise is particularly honored in Dubrovnik, Croatia, where he is the patron saint
