Baptism: If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

From the Rector's Desk

**5th Sunday of Lent – Share Lent
(with Scrutiny at 9:00 and Baptisms at 11:00)**

While the Lenten social/liturgical calendar isn't quite as intense as Advent, there's plenty to offer our community of faith. One significant event was our Lenten Mission. But with the Mission and Penitential Service now over, I'm left evaluating its effectiveness for the good of the Parish. Bishop Joseph was an excellent proclaimer of the gospel and I thank God for his marvellous witness to our faith. While many people partook of the mission at the weekday Masses, there was an underwhelming attendance at all the evening services, including the Penitential Service on the Tuesday. I believe I've now coordinated two Advent and two Lenten Missions with Penitential Services and the pattern appears to be consistent with a low level of engagement of the majority for the evening celebrations. I'll be discussing this with the Parish Council on Tuesday, but welcome any input that might help me to plan for future extraordinary spiritual opportunities. Speaking of which, this coming week take note of our beautiful annual Chrism Mass on the 26th at 7:00 p.m., and following our Saturday Vigil Mass the 28th an occasion for a holy hour of adoration.

Last Friday in our Parish Centre, the Soup Kitchen leadership facilitated an excellent neighborhood meeting for View St. shop owners, police and facility managers, to discuss the challenges of social disorder. While it's disheartening that the subject requires so much time and energy, it was certainly of benefit to build good community relations with others in our 'hood'. The commitment to compassionate care, combined with a fortified resolve to be intolerant of intolerable behaviours was actually quite encouraging. It was a revelation to discover the street police must travel in threes for their own security and safety, leaving the rest of us feeling even more vulnerable. Regardless, the resolve to tackle issues and be of service to the majority of 'diners' who peacefully and gratefully receive a lovingly served hot meal is commendable. As a side note, our security personnel Michael, who has done a stellar job of keeping the peace on Sunday mornings has taken a leave. Let's hope with extra policing we won't need to replace him.

With St. Joseph's Solemnity on the 19th and the Assumption of Our Lady on the 25th, there's cause for late Lenten reprieve and celebration (not to mention St. Patrick who I'll celebrate today by hearing confessions at the parish penitential service of his patronage in Oak Bay). Not tied directly to St. Patrick, but in solidarity with him, a large

gathering of male catechumens, candidates and sponsors joined together this past Monday at the Penny Farthing for fellowship and great conversation. They hope to repeat the event monthly. It's hard to believe that next week we're celebrating Palm/Passion Sunday and entering into our holiest of weeks. The bulletin and website should contain the schedule of liturgies as we enter into the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord. While not well defined as yet, I'd like to offer a simple Children's Liturgy of the Word with Veneration of the Cross on Good Friday at 11:00 a.m. All other liturgies should be very familiar to us as Bishop Gary comes to celebrate and lead us in worship. Lenten peace be with you.

Respect Life Ministry – Update

Respect Life Ministry (RLM) has been a vital outreach of St. Andrew's Cathedral since August 2010.

OUR SUPPORT AND FUNDING

RLM is entirely supported by your generosity. We are deeply humbled by every donation, which comes from both clients (who are able to contribute) and parishioners who make one-time, monthly or yearly gifts. Respect Life Ministry is financially separate from the parish operating budget.

With your help, RLM has supported over 400 mothers, fathers, and their preborn babies. Our practical support includes:

- nursery items, car seats, strollers, and breast pumps, diapers, dressers and newborn to 3-month-old clothing and blankets
- grocery gift cards throughout the year
- the cost of private (when needed) and group sessions at Mothering Touch, where parents attend labour and delivery classes, learn newborn care, and receive infant first aid training

We mentor and support parents throughout pregnancy and continue to offer assistance after birth.

RLM also provides confidential counselling and mentorship in difficult areas such as:

- Addiction
- Miscarriage and post-abortion healing
- Relationship issues between couples
- Personal growth and trauma healing

When necessary, RLM provides referrals to professional clinicians and treatment facilities in Victoria specializing in trauma and serious mental health issues. All work conducted through the RLM offices is kept strictly confidential.

LOOKING AHEAD

We are currently in the brainstorming phase of developing a new initiative dedicated to ensuring that 'no one dies alone.' Additionally, we will soon be introducing "Theology of the Body" sessions for women and for men, in response to those seeking to learn more about the gift of their sexuality. This is a response to the hypersexualized culture we live in.

Last, however not least, a heartfelt thank you to all our prayer warriors and financial donors: thank you so much. On behalf of every individual and family served by your generosity, we are profoundly grateful for your generosity.

What is Intercessory Prayer?

Intercessory prayer is a vital practice in the Christian faith. It involves praying on behalf of others. This gift allows believers to support one another spiritually. Through intercession, prayers become a powerful tool for change.

Intercessory prayer means praying specifically for others. Unlike personal prayer, where one asks God for their own needs or guidance, intercession focuses entirely on the needs of the person asking for prayer. It is an act of love and compassion, showing concern for the well-being of others. Intercessors stand in the gap between God and those they pray for, acting as spiritual advocates. This kind of prayer is often persistent and filled with faith, trusting that God hears and responds.
