If there is one principle that is fundamental to our Catholic faith, it is care for the poor. The psalm for August 31, Psalm 68 says: "God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor." But the majority of us do not strive to be poor; in fact, quite the opposite. We dream of wealth and power.

We strive for better jobs, bigger houses, new cars. We follow on social media models who seem happy, and yes, rich: pop stars, corporate giants, Tik Tok influencers.

And yet who among us has not felt the utter poverty of loneliness and yes, encounters with death?

It is only after repeated disappointment with the dazzling toys of the world and yes, the loss of who and what we love, that we consider a quiet hour at church in prayer. And there we behold the man on the Cross.

Look at Him: a picture of utter poverty, helplessness and defeat. And yet, He is my model. Precisely because He is not of this world. Who is yours?

From the Rector's Desk 22nd & 23rd Sundays in Ordinary Time August 31 & September 7, 2025

Some years ago, I watched a Canadian comedy film that was both inspiring and hilarious called "Seducing Dr. Lewis" (a French language original set in Quebec was titled "La Grande Séduction"). The basic plot is that a small fishing-dependant village in rural Canada has lost its livelihood with the cod closure, become totally dependant on welfare and desperate to get some honest work. None can be found with the exception of a plastic manufacturing plant willing to settle in the village "IF" they have a resident doctor. Through a nefarious intervention, a Montreal police officer and former villager pulls over a guilty big city plastic surgeon and persuades him to avoid a criminal charge if he spends a month in the coastal village. The whole community then gets behind a deceptive plot to 'seduce Dr. Lewis' into staying. It was so funny! How is any of this relevant to St. Andrew's? Well, behind the full and beautiful sacramental celebrations on the weekend, with obvious differences, some of us were attempting to 'seduce' a potential Director of Musical Worship to come and help lead our liturgical future. I ought not to mention much detail, but this 'out of country' young, faithful, accomplished applicant wowed our music committee with his proficiency on organ and piano, while competently and graciously leading a choir practice 'audition'. I spent the weekend hosting our "Dr. Lewis", ensuring he was well fed and entertained. It was an excellent weekend, but ultimately, we leave the selection in the hands of the Lord. In good fishing analogy, I would like to think he's a 'keeper' and we've got him on the line; but we have a long way to go before reeling him in and getting him in the boat. Please join us in prayer for the Lord's will to be done.'

While most of the anecdotal feedback I'm hearing from newcomers and visitors to the Cathedral Masses (as well as long timers) is so very positive about our sense of community and inspiring worship, it's not for all. Recently, I blessed someone who informed me they needed to find another Catholic parish home due to a sense of 'crowding', and other issues. In part we're trying to address this with a 'system' of seating those arriving late for Mass in order to preserve decorum during the reading of the Word of God. It's actually been working the last two weeks (particularly at the 11:00 on Sunday) with folks waiting to be seated, if arriving after the Gloria is sung, until the children are called forward for their homily. What a great challenge to have, one that many parishes would envy! Another challenge, is the now weekly interactions with erratically behaved people in and on Church property that the staff and volunteers are

facing. It's a real concern for the well-being and safety of our people and requires some strategic planning as a downtown parish.

As we head into the new school season after Labour Day, Rita returns to the office from holiday and Matthew transitions to his new Pastoral Assistant role. Elsewhere Matthew will be introducing himself and I welcome him to his new role with gratitude and excitement for the expansion of our pastoral mission. We're going to be needing a new staff replacement in the parish office and with Rita back in the saddle we'll work toward hiring in earnest. As we move into the fall, with parish council, I'd like to see us maintain great sacramental ministry, and yet, with Matthew's help, focus a little more on the Sunday basics of 1) Hospitality and Evangelization, 2) Discipleship Education, 3) Healing Prayer of the wounded, and 4) Christian Service Outreach. In terms of healing, we certainly have many grieving the loss of loved ones in our community. With staff and volunteer assistance, I'm caring for about seven families as I prepare to celebrate funeral/memorial liturgies. May the Holy Spirit comfort those who mourn and may the Resurrected Lord raise up those who have fallen 'asleep' in him.
