Sacramental Information

Baptism: If you are seeking the Baptism of an infant, please contact the parish office at 250-388-5571. As Baptism is the first Sacrament of initiation into the Christian faith, we expect that the parents (or guardians) desire to raise the child in the Christian faith and will attend Mass regularly.

Marriage: Because the Church is deeply concerned about each marriage, couples are asked to give a minimum of six months' notice prior to the intended date of their wedding. Church policy requires that marriages be performed in your home parish – unless you are registered and attend elsewhere.

Funeral: Individual arrangements with a priest. Begin by calling the parish office.

You simply need to register. Registration forms are available in the Cathedral Narthex. Simply fill it out and place your completed form in the collection basket.

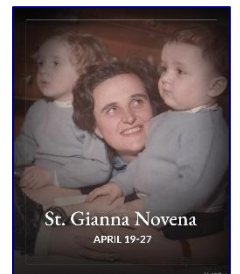

From the Pastoral Assistant's Desk

3rd Sunday of Easter

Fr. Dean is away for a few days of holy retreat, reflection, and recuperation with the Benedictine monks at the Abbey in Mission after a busy season of ministry, and he's asked that I take the opportunity to share a few updates in his absence.

First of all, we are thrilled to welcome Iason Giagtzoglou at long last, who arrived in Victoria on Tuesday and is already getting to work taking up his new role as Music Director at St. Andrew's Cathedral. Thanks be to God! And thank you for your many prayers. Iason will be jumping right in, leading the choirs for most of this weekend's Masses. He's also busy familiarizing himself with our parish and existing music ministry, and even beginning preparations to provide music for a range of weddings and funerals. Let's warmly welcome Iason this weekend!

This past Monday evening, 17 disciples of Christ gathered for the first session of the 6-week "Source" faith study, diving into the Scriptures with lively discussion to explore and get to know the Holy Spirit and how he acts in the Church and in our Christian lives. Many had previously joined us in one of the recent offerings of "Discovery" for a challenging and personal encounter with the core of the Gospel message. It's truly inspiring to witness the growth and sincerity of faith among these participants, some of whom are newly exploring the Catholic faith. Thanks to Daniel Alvarez for continuing to volunteer to co-lead this group!

Speaking of which, I've been blessed to meet individually with an ever-growing number of adult seekers of faith, who are enquiring about becoming Catholic. Many of these connections originate from an encounter at the welcome table on the plaza following Sunday morning Masses, or a courageous email to introduce themselves and ask how to go about this. Let's continue to work together as a faith community to actively welcome newcomers and anyone who might be searching with a spirit of loving hospitality, ready to meet Christ in every face. What a joy it was to witness the 32 adults who were baptized and/or received into the Catholic Church this Easter Vigil and Divine Mercy Sunday, and who have been journeying through the RCIA program since September! In addition to these, another 9 Catholics received the sacrament of Confirmation last week along with an infant baptism. Altogether, 38 people received the body and

blood of our Lord in the holy Eucharist for the very first time this Easter Octave. Many more children of our parish will also be celebrating their First Reconciliation, Confirmation, and First Eucharist through the children's Sacramental Preparation program within the next month or so. I'd say the graces of God are evident in the amazing sacramental ministry at St. Andrew's!

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

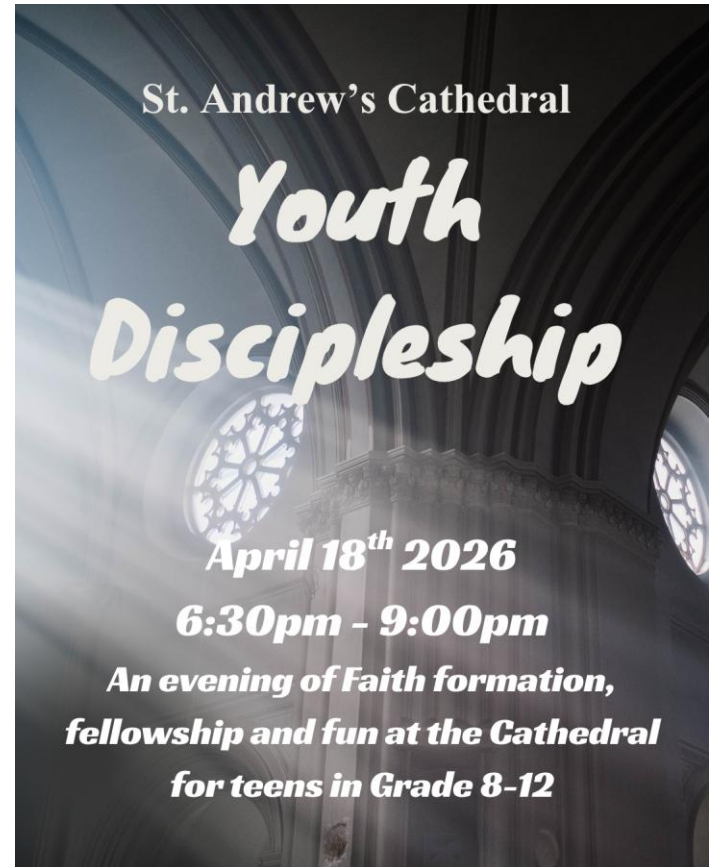

Reflection on the Holy Father's Call for Peace, Human Dignity, and Moral Responsibility in Public Life

The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has issued a reflection on Pope Leo's call for peace, human dignity, and moral responsibility in public life, which may be read in full below. The faithful in Canada are encouraged to continue praying for the Holy Father, for peace among nations, and for all who suffer because of war.



"In light of recent public commentary surrounding the Holy Father's appeals for peace, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops' (CCCCB) Communications Service wishes to reiterate several principles of Catholic teaching that remain especially relevant in times of war and international tension.

Pope Leo XIV's witness in such moments is moral and pastoral, not partisan. His words remind the world that peace is never advanced by contempt, that leadership requires restraint, and that the suffering of innocent people should always be avoided as much as possible.

Catholic teaching holds that war is subject to strict conditions of moral legitimacy. The use of force cannot be presumed to be just a priori; it must satisfy grave and demanding criteria, and may be considered only as a last resort. Even where force is judged permissible, the protection of civilians remains a fundamental obligation. The destruction of essential civilian infrastructure and the resulting suffering of non-combatants are to be avoided.

It is also important to recall that imagery or rhetoric presenting political leaders in terms that belong uniquely to Christ and His saving work is wholly unfitting. In addition to being disrespectful,

such representations blur the proper distinction between faith and political power, distorting the meaning of both.

As a Catholic institution with a national mandate, the CCCB does not intervene in the internal political affairs of other countries. At the same time, recent events make it opportune to underscore the moral principles that should inform public life everywhere, including truthfulness, humility, reverence, and concern for the innocent.

The faithful in Canada are encouraged to continue praying for the Holy Father, for peace among nations, and for all who suffer because of war."
